By The Commission:

This matter is before the Commission on the September 16, 2013, application of Qwest Corporation dba CenturyLink QC ("CenturyLink") for approval to discontinue its Wireless Use Program.

On September 18, 2013, the Commission issued a notice of filing and comment period in this docket. The notice of comment period ended on October 18, 2013, and no adverse comments were filed.

On October 4, 2013, the Division of Public Utilities (the "Division") submitted its recommendation to approve the application. "The Division agrees with the request and recommends the Commission allow CenturyLink to discontinue the [Wireless Use] Program. The Program allowed U S West to offer an unlimited usage wireless phone option to primary held order customers when it becomes apparent that the order will be held longer than 7 days beyond the due date on the order. . . . The primary reason for this Program was to mitigate held orders as a result of the growth that was happening in the telecommunications marketplace in 1995. Because of changing market conditions[,] such as customers having their own personal cellular phone[s], Qwest began phasing out the purchasing of cell phones in 2003 or 2004 and discontinued the [P]rogram in 2010. . . . Because held orders are not as significant an issue as in

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1995[;]...the Program was only a requirement of CenturyLink, and no customers have been using the [P]rogram since 2010[;] the Division recommends approving the discontinuance of the [Wireless Use] Program." Division Memo at 1, filed October 4, 2013.

#### **ORDER**

Having reviewed the application, the Division's recommendation, and there being no opposition filed, the Commission finds approval of the application to be just and reasonable, and in the public interest. Accordingly, we approve the discontinuance of the Wireless Use Program.
