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1	PROCEEDINGS
2	THE HEARING OFFICER: We're on the record
3	and I'm Melanie Reif. I'm the administrative law
4	judge for the Utah Public Service Commission. And
5	thank you very much for being here this morning.
6	Let's start by taking appearances starting with
7	you, Mr. Forte.
8	MR. FORTE: Yes. Hi. This is Thomas M.
9	Forte, Consultant for Matrix Telecom, AmericaTel
10	Corporation, and Impact Telecom. And I work for
11	Technologies Management, Inc.
12	THE HEARING OFFICER: Thank you,
13	Mr. Forte. And, just for clarification, do you
14	have anybody on the line with you?
15	MR. FORTE: No. I'm justyou know,
16	normally I provide testimony for the Company.
17	THE HEARING OFFICER: Okay, excellent.
18	Great. Thank you for that clarification.
19	MR. JETTER: And I'm Justin Jetter. I'm
20	an assistant attorney general for the State of
21	Utah and I represent the Utah Division of Public
22	Utilities. And with me at counsel table here is
23	Paul Hicken, the witness for the Utah Division of
24	Public Utilities.
25	THE HEARING OFFICER: Thank you very

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1	much. Welcome this morning. Just for
2	clarification, we're holding this hearing in
3	Docket 15-2452-01. This is a hearing to address
4	the application to transfer customers of Impact
5	Telecom, Inc. to Matrix Telecom, Inc.
6	Mr. Forte, typically, we start with the
7	applicant, so would you like to give us some
8	background? And I don't know if you have a copy
9	of the notice of hearing with you, but one of the
10	important elements that we need to cover this
11	morning is the issue of whether the proposed
12	transfer of customers from Impact to Matrix will
13	be in the public interest. And inasmuch as you
14	are planning to testify on behalf of the
15	applicant, I would like to swear you in. So if
16	that's the case, please let me know.
17	MR. FORTE: Yes, I can testify.
18	THE HEARING OFFICER: Okay. Would you
19	kindly raise your right hand, please? And do you
20	swear that the testimony that you're about to give
21	will be the truth?
22	MR.FORTE: I do.
23	THOMAS M. FORTE,
24	having been first duly sworn, was
25	examined and testified as follows:

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1	THE HEARING OFFICER: Thank you. You may
2	proceed, sir.
3	MR. FORTE: Yes. The merger that we're
4	talking about here between Impact and Matrix is
5	definitely in the public interest in the fact
6	that, currently, Matrix is a subsidiary of Impact.
7	And all this is is a pro forma corporate
8	reorganization. And so now Matrix will be the
9	only company providing telecom services to the
10	industry, to customers. Impact will turn into a
11	holding company and, therefore, customers will not
12	be harmed because customers will still get the
13	same service because it's still under the same
14	corporate governance.
15	THE HEARING OFFICER: Thank you, sir.
16	Are there any questions for Mr. Forte?
17	MR. JETTER: I have no questions.
18	THE HEARING OFFICER: Okay. Mr. Forte,
19	just one question of you, please. Are you aware
20	of any concerns that have been raised by customers
21	as a result of this request?
22	MR. FORTE: No. I am not aware of any
23	concerns. All customers were provided with notice
24	of the potential change. And from all my dealings
25	with the company, I have not heard any issues with

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1	customer complaints or customer worries.
2	THE HEARING OFFICER: Okay. Thank you
3	very much. Mr. Forte, if you have the ability to
4	mute your end of the line, it could help us on our
5	end. But if you don't, don't worry about it. I'm
6	now going to turn to Mr. Jetter for his
7	presentation. Mr. Jetter.
8	MR. JETTER: Thank you, Your Honor. The
9	Division would like to have sworn in Paul Hicken.
10	THE HEARING OFFICER: Good morning,
11	Mr. Hicken.
12	MR. HICKEN: Good morning.
13	THE HEARING OFFICER: Would you please
14	raise your right hand? And do you swear the
15	testimony you're about to give will be the truth?
16	MR. HICKEN: Yes.
17	THE HEARING OFFICER: Thank you.
18	PAUL HICKEN,
19	having been first duly sworn, was
20	examined and testified as follows:
21	EXAMINATION
22	BY-MR.JETTER:
23	Q. Would you please state your name and
24	occupation for the record.
25	A. My name is Paul Hicken. I work as a

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1	utility analyst for the Division of Public
2	Utilities.
3	Q. Thank you. And have you reviewed the
4	application filed by the two companies, Impact
5	Telecom and Matrix Telecom, in this docket?
6	A. Yes.
7	Q. And has the Division reached a conclusion
8	on whether or not it recommends approval of this
9	application?
10	A. Yes, it has.
11	Q. Would you please go ahead and
12	A. Read that?
13	Qread that.
14	A. Thank you. The Division of Public
15	Utilities has reviewed the joint application
16	between Impact Telecom, Inc. and Matrix Telecom,
17	Inc. and believes that the public interest will be
18	promoted by recommending that the Public Service
19	Commission allow this transfer of customers.
20	Following the transfer, Impact will no
21	longer operate as a telecommunications provider
22	and a request to cancel their certificate of
23	public convenience and necessity will be filed
24	with the Commission at that time. The Division
25	expects that based on history, that a filing of



1	this type and with the information submitted by
2	the Company, there will be no objections or
3	opposition to this recommendation.
4	Q. Thank you. And that memorandum was
5	provided to the Commission in which that language
6	is found on March 26, 2015; is that correct?
7	A. That's right.
8	Q. And since that time, are you aware of any
9	other objections that have been raised in this
10	application?
11	A. No, I'm not.
12	Q. And do you believe that approval of the
13	application as it's been submitted would be in the
14	public interest as well as just and reasonable?
15	A. Yes, it would.
16	MR. JETTER: Thank you. I have no
17	further questions. Our witness is available for
18	cross or questions from
19	THE HEARING OFFICER: Mr. Forte, do you
20	have any questions for the witness, Mr. Hicken?
21	MR. FORTE: No, I do not.
22	THE HEARING OFFICER: Okay. Thank you.
23	Thank you for your testimony today, Mr. Hicken.
24	For the record, I want to take care of a
25	couple of administrative matters. And that is

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1	that the Commission takes notice of the applicant,
2	which wasexcuse methe application, which was
3	filed on March 10, 2015, as well as the Division's
4	memorandum, which was filed on March 26, 2015.
5	And, lastly, I wish to ask whether
6	there's anyone present who wishes to address the
7	Commission who has not already done so. Hearing
8	no interest, this matter will be under advisement
9	and an order will be issued shortly. Thank you
10	very much for being here today and we'll be
11	adjourned. Thank you.
