In this filing CenturyLink is removing the direct dial coin feature on smart public access lines provided by CenturyLink. The direct dial coin feature is no longer supportable due to the age of the technology and the inability to secure technical support and knowledge on how to make the feature work with the new SIP signaling and difficulty securing sites to complete viable testing. CenturyLink will continue to support 0+ or 0- intraLATA calling. 1+ interLATA calling will continue to be provided by FGD (long-distance service providers).

Qwest Corporation d/b/a CenturyLink QC plans to make this filing effective on March 12, 2018.
