Dear Ms. Zink,

The Public Service Commission ("PSC") has reviewed Citizens Telecommunications Company of Utah d/b/a Frontier Communications of Utah's ("Frontier") proposed revisions to Schedule No. A-3, Bundled Services, Sheet Nos. 1, 8, 9, 10, 11, 32, 33, 33.1, 34, 35, 49, 50, 51, 55, 56, 57, 58, 59, and 60 filed on April 18, 2019. Frontier states the purpose of the filing is to grandfather certain residential bundles. Frontier requests an effective date of May 18, 2019 for the proposed changes.

The PSC also reviewed the April 22, 2019 comments of the Division of Public Utilities ("DPU"). The DPU states it has no objection to Frontier grandfathering the residential bundles and recommends the filing become effective on or before May 18, 2019.

Having reviewed the proposed tariff revisions and the DPU's recommendation, the PSC approves the tariff sheets as filed, with an effective date of May 18, 2019.¹

¹ Going forward, Frontier should file clean and redline versions of proposed tariff sheets as required by Utah Admin. Code R746-405-2(D)(6), and provide a statement the proposed tariff revisions do not constitute a violation of state law or PSC rule pursuant to Utah Admin. Code R746-405-2(D)(3)(g). We conclude, without prejudice to dissimilar conclusions in future filings, that in this instance these deficiencies are not material enough to be a basis to suspend or deny the tariff.
