Re: *Skyline Telecom's Proposed Tariff Revisions*; Docket No. 20-576-T01

Dear Ms. Wimer,

The Public Service Commission (PSC) has reviewed Skyline Telecom's ("Skyline") proposed revisions to Page Nos. 2, 48, and 50 of its Access Service, Skyline Telecom, P.S.C. Utah No. 2 Tariff ("Tariff"), filed May 19, 2020. As an initial matter, Skyline did not file a redlined version of its proposed tariff changes as required under Utah Admin. Code R746-405-2(D)(6). Skyline also omits the statement that its proposed tariff sheet does not constitute a violation of state law or PSC rule, as required under Utah Admin. Code R746-405-2(D)(3)(g). Nevertheless, the PSC is approving the proposed revisions, but reminds Skyline that these omissions in future filings might delay or prevent approval.

Skyline explains the proposed rates reflect the final step down of End Office terminating rates as prescribed by FCC rules and states the rates must be in effect by July 1, 2020. The PSC also reviewed the comments of the Division of Public Utilities (DPU) filed on June 2, 2020. The DPU recommends the PSC approve Skyline's proposed revision to its Local Transport-LTR and Local Switching-LTR intrastate access rates as presented in the filing.

Based on its review of Skyline's filing and the DPU's comments and recommendation, the PSC approves Skyline's proposed revisions to its Tariff as filed, effective July 1, 2020.
