Dear Ms. Wimer,

The Public Service Commission (PSC) has reviewed Central Utah Telephone, Inc.'s ("Central") proposed revisions to Page Nos. 2, 46, 48, 49, and 50 of its PSC Utah No. 2 Tariff ("Tariff"), transmitted on May 14, 2021. The purpose of this filing is to comply with Federal Communications Commission amended rules that implement 8YY access charge reform. This reform requires all rate-of-return incumbent local exchange carriers to modify originating 8YY rates in the following groups: End Office/Local Switching, Transport, and Query Charge. Central requests an effective date of July 1, 2021 for these changes.

The PSC also reviewed the comments of the Division of Public Utilities (DPU) filed on May 25, 2021. DPU states it has no objections to the proposed changes and recommends the PSC approve Central's proposed revisions to the Tariff with the requested effective date. According to DPU, the proposed Tariff revisions are consistent with the FCC's 8YY Access Charge Reform Order.

Based on its review of Central's filing and DPU's comments and recommendation, the PSC approves Central's proposed revisions to its Tariff, as filed, effective July 1, 2021.
