Dear Ms. Wimer,

The Public Service Commission (PSC) has reviewed Central Utah Telephone, Inc.'s ("Central Utah") proposed revisions to Page Nos. 2, 46, 48, 49, and 50 of its PSC Utah No. 2 Tariff ("Tariff"), filed on May 27, 2022 (the "Filing"). Central Utah submits the Filing in accordance with Federal Communications Commission (FCC) amended rules that implement 8YY access charge reform.<sup>1</sup> Central Utah indicates its proposed Tariff revisions reduce the relevant rates, as required by the FCC's 8YY access charge reform order ("Order"), and requests an effective date of July 1, 2022.

The PSC also reviewed the comments of the Division of Public Utilities (DPU) filed on June 8, 2022. DPU states the proposed revisions appear to comply with the FCC's Order and therefore recommends the PSC approve them, effective July 1, 2022.

Based on the PSC's review of Central Utah's Filing, DPU's comments and its recommendation, the PSC approves Central Utah's proposed revisions to its Tariff, as filed, effective July 1, 2022.
