Dear Mr. Denzel,

The Public Service Commission (PSC) reviewed Central Utah Telephone, Inc.'s ("Central Utah") proposed Tariff Revisions to its interstate switched access rates (the "Tariff Revisions") filed on May 20, 2025 (the "Filing"), in compliance with Federal Communications Commission (FCC) rules governing intercarrier compensation. Central Utah indicates that the proposed rates are based on an 18.4483% interstate switched access rate decrease, as announced by the National Exchange Carrier Association (NECA) on April 10, 2025. Central Utah states that if the FCC-approved NECA rates differ, their rates will be adjusted accordingly. Central Utah requests an effective date of July 1, 2025.

The PSC also reviewed the comments filed by the Division of Public Utilities (DPU) on June 3, 2025. DPU comments that Central Utah is requesting a decrease in twenty Local Transport rates, which Central Utah is not using but instead holding them as placeholder rates unless necessary. DPU concludes that the decrease in rates has no impact on Central Utah's revenue. DPU has no concerns with the proposed Tariff Revisions and recommends the PSC approve the Filing, effective July 1, 2025.
