# PROCEDURAL HISTORY

On April 7, 2001, AT&T Communications of the Mountain States, Inc. (Applicant), filed its Application seeking approval for its acquisition, as part of bankruptcy proceedings, of part of the assets in bankruptcy of Northpoint Communications. The matter was referred for analysis and recommendation to the Division of Public Utilities, Utah Department of Commerce (DPU), which filed its memorandum recommending approval April 25, 2001. As our findings of fact in this matter, we adopt to findings contained in the DPU memorandum, which is annexed hereto and incorporated herein by this reference.

# **CONCLUSIONS OF LAW**

No detriment to the public interest appearing, the proposed acquisition should be approved.

- Applicant's acquisition of certain assets in bankruptcy of Northpoint Communications be, and it is, approved effective the date of this Order.

#### **Issues:**

AT&T Communications of the Mountain States ("AT&T") filed the above-mentioned application on April 17, 2001, pursuant to *Utah Code §54-4-30*. NorthPoint received its Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity on December 16, 1999 in Docket No. 99-2288-01.

AT&T Corp. provides service to its Utah customers through its operating subsidiary, AT&T Communications of the Mountain States, Inc. The Commission granted AT&T its certification to provide local and interexchange telecommunications services in Docket Nos. 83-087-01, 92-087-01, and 96-087-01.

NorthPoint filed for Chapter 11 bankruptcy protection on January 16, 2001. On March 22, 2001, the Bankruptcy Court approve the sale of NorthPoint assets to AT&T after AT&T emerged as the successful bidder in a Bankruptcy Court auction of selected assets of NorthPoint. The assets to be purchased include allocation space, operating support systems and various DSL equipment in Utah and other states. AT&T anticipates that the asset purchase will close within 60 days and, accordingly, requests that the Commission expedite this application.

NorthPoint has not retail customers; its only customers are businesses that resell NorthPoint DSL services. AT&T is advised that, except to the extent necessary to wind down the business in accordance with federal Bankruptcy Court's forthcoming order, NorthPoint will cease all operation.

AT&T believes that the acquisition is in the public interest because "it will enable existing facilities and equipment that otherwise would be dismantled or be left dormant to be put to use in providing Utah consumers with competitive alternatives for advanced services."

#### **Recommendation:**

The Division believes that the information that AT&T has provided is sufficient for the Division to recommend approval and should be considered under R746-110, which permits uncontested matters to be adjudicated informally.
