PROCEDURAL HISTORY

On July 16, 2001, SCSC, Inc., a certificated water corporation, sought cancellation of its Certificate of Convenience and Necessity, alleging that all its utility assets had been sold to Mountain Regional Water Special Service District, a quasi-governmental entity which has assumed responsibility for operating Petitioner's former system. The Division of Public Utilities, Utah Department of Commerce (DPU), has reviewed the matter and recommended approval.
