

Thank you for supporting clean energy through Rocky Mountain Power's Blue SkySM program. Here is the annual report for your renewable energy purchases in 2006. You can be proud of all you've helped achieve by participating in this program.

You made a difference last year

Your total 2006 Blue Sky purchase of **XXX** kilowatt-hours helped create a cleaner environment by reducing **X** pounds of carbon dioxide emissions into the atmosphere. This represents environmental benefits equal to not driving **XXX** miles. Your current purchase is **XX** block(s) per month.

The combined Blue Sky purchases of the more than 51,000 participating households and businesses in 2006 had benefits equal to taking 51,368 cars off the road for one year. These renewable energy purchases were equivalent to the output of 65 utility-scale turbines.

Real progress here, now

The Blue Sky program continues to support generation from wind projects in the western region including Pleasant Valley and Foote Creek IV in Wyoming.

In 2006 your participation helped spur the installation of a 20 kw solar array on the Salt Palace Convention Center in downtown Salt Lake City, helping reduce carbon dioxide emissions by 72,472 pounds (36.2 tons). That's equivalent to planting 14 acres of trees or not driving 77,600 miles.

Your demand for 100 percent renewable energy is also helping foster the construction of the Spanish Fork Wind Park 2, a 19 mw wind farm scheduled to be operational in 2008, as well as other small community-based projects expected to come on line in the next few years.

We look forward to continuing our work with you in creating a cleaner energy future. Enclosed you'll find a Blue Sky bumper sticker to help you show your support for renewable energy. Look for more Blue Sky program updates in our *Forecast* newsletter this spring.
