LIST OF ISSUES TO BE ADDRESSED OF SALT LAKE COMMUNITY ACTION PROGRAM, CROSSROADS URBAN CENTER AND UTAH LEGISLATIVE WATCH, COLLECTIVELY KNOWN AS THE UTAH RATEPAYERS ALLIANCE

In response to the Utah Public Service Commission's Revised Scheduling Order of June 18, 2003, in Docket No. 02-035-T12, Salt Lake Community Action Program, Crossroads Urban Center, and Utah Legislative Watch (collectively known as the Utah Ratepayers Alliance) submit the following list of issues which we believe merit discussion in future technical conferences. It is possible that in the course of further discussion, other issues may arise.

Tariff Rider Mechanism

1. How cost projections for inclusion in annual tariff rider amount will be developed
2. Time frame for collection of initial deferred amount
3. Whether current DSM projects should be rolled into tariff rider or continue to be included in the revenue requirement and reviewed during rate cases
4. How DSM charge should be presented on bills
5. Spread of DSM costs to rate schedules and calculation of rates, including special contracts
6. Consider sunset and/or review provisions

Self-Direction Proposal

1. Overall objectives of provision
2. Eligibility of Customers
 - A. Size of customer
 - B. Single customer or aggregated load

C. Specific rate schedules

3. Eligibility of Projects

- A. Appropriate payback period
- B. Past projects
- C. Participation in other utility programs

4. Credit

- A. Which project expenses qualify for expenses to be considered for credit
- B. Percent of project to be considered for credit
- C. Maximum amount of DSM charge eligible for credit
- D. Appropriateness and amount of credit for customers that have implemented all cost-effective DSM

5. Administration of Self-Directed Program

- A. Who administers the program and how is the administrator selected
- B. Procedures for project selection, approval and evaluation
- C. Costs of administering the program
