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Desert Power, L.P. (“Desert Power”), pursuant to Utah Code Ann. §63-46b-9 and Utah Admin. R. 746-100-7, petitions the Public Service Commission of Utah for leave to intervene in the above-captioned docket. The grounds for the petition are as follows:

1. Desert Power operates a power production facility near Rowley Utah that is capable of generating approximately 65 MW of power. On January 23, 2004, Desert Power filed a petition asking this Commission to approve a contract to sell capacity and energy from its facility and proposed a method for calculating avoided costs. Although Desert Power wants the Commission to expeditiously and separately address the issues it raised in the January 23<sup>rd</sup> petition within Docket No. 04-035-04, the outcome of this proceeding could substantially affect that case, Desert Power’s legal rights, and its ability to sell power from its facility in Utah.
2. Desert Power’s intervention and participation in this matter will not materially impair the prompt and orderly conduct of these proceedings.

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NOW THEREFORE, Desert Power respectfully requests that the Commission enter an Order granting Desert Power's petition to intervene in this docket allowing Desert Power to participate to the full extent allowed by law.
