Quick update on the PacifiCorp situation...

1. It appears the pole audit in American Fork hub is accurate. Although the PacifiCorp map given to us is very difficult to identify pole strings relative to meridian, townships and ranges. The map that we received from PacifiCorp shows their boundaries on an approximately 1" to 2,600' scale. It does not relate to individual pole locations on these maps. Our audit utilized our maps in the approximate same location of their serving area and pole counts were very close. As far as the individual pole numbers that need to be permitted, this will be almost impossible to complete, without detailed pole numbers identified and databases consistent between PacifiCorp and Comcast.
2. We have stopped the audits going forward unless it is deemed necessary from all involved as it appears this may be a waste of Comcast funds due to the accuracy of the records.
3. Pole permits for power supplies seem to need attention from PacifiCorp. We have submitted over 162 applications and have received 8 back since before and during the shutdown. This will hamper our upgrade efforts.
4. PacifiCorp has implemented a program called "Quantum Leap". This is a program whereas they are upgrading their facilities with new poles or towers and are informing us that we must vacate and go underground. This will cost Comcast a considerable amount of money. Still unknown at this point the implications. We were just recently brought aware of the situation.
5. We still need to address the issue of our payments to them for poles in Vernal, Cedar City, and other locations where we do not own the cable system.

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
