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31 Wasatch Wind petitions the Commission for a hearing to resolve interconnection
32 and station service power needs at its Spanish Fork Wind Park 2 due to be constructed in
33 the fourth quarter of 2007. A Power Purchase Agreement was executed on June 29, 2007
34 between Spanish Fork Wind Park 2, LLC and PacifiCorp and approved by the Public
35 Service Commission on July 13, 2006. The Power Purchase Agreement states that
36 Spanish Fork Wind Park 2, LLC must post security to PacifiCorp by June 29, 2007. In
37 order for the investor of the wind farm to post security, we request the Commission to
38 arbitrate the issue approving who should supply auxiliary power to the wind farm at the

1 public hearing on June 28, 2007.

2 Background: During Small Generation Interconnection Agreement discussions
3 with PacifiCorp, Spanish Fork Wind Park 2, LLC was told it needed a retail service
4 agreement with Spanish Fork City for any power needs it may have. The wind farm is
5 located in Spanish Fork City and therefore, any auxiliary power that the wind farm would
6 need, Spanish Fork City is required to supply. Spanish Fork City has requested that a
7 distribution line be run to the wind farm but are willing to look at other options subject to
8 Utah Municipal Power Agency's approval. Due to the nature of wind turbines, a separate
9 distribution line is not electrically feasible. See attached Memo for our rationale.

10 Based on the Power Purchase Agreement, PacifiCorp will be paying Spanish Fork
11 Wind Park on its Net Output. Net Output is defined as "all energy produced by the
12 Facility, less station use and less transformation and transmission losses to the Point of
13 Delivery, if any.

14 As you can see, Spanish Fork Wind Park 2, LLC is in a quandary. Based on the
15 Power Purchase Agreement, it would appear we do not need have a problem getting the
16 power from the existing line. However, based on PacifiCorp's transmission side, we are
17 being told we need a contractual agreement with the City. This is why we have asked the
18 Public Service Commission to arbitrate the issue.
