	)	<u>ORDER GRANTING REQUEST FOR RECONSIDERATION</u>
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ISSUED: September 22, 2008

By the Commission:

On September 22, 2008, Rocky Mountain Power (RMP) filed its Petition for Reconsideration of our August 11, 2008, Report and Order on revenue requirement. RMP raises a number of matters upon which it seeks reconsideration and rehearing. On September 17, 2008, the Division of Public Utilities (DPU), the Committee of Consumer Service, the UAE Intervention Group, and the UIEC filed their responses the RMP's September 22 Petition. All but the DPU argue the Commission should deny the Petition. The DPU supports reconsideration of the SMUD contract adjustment and the property tax adjustment.

Based upon our review of these pleadings, we conclude we will grant reconsideration. We will inform the parties if additional evidence and hearings will be sought by the Commission.
