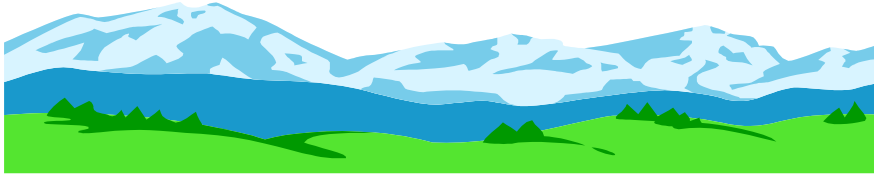

Thank you for the opportunity to comment on this matter, and for extending the comment period

Wasatch Clean Air Coalition endorses the comments submitted by Utah Clean Energy, et al, and respectfully adds these personal, non-technical notes.

The Blue Sky program is very popular among Utah customers. As you know, Utahns have one of the highest participation rates in this type of green tariff programs of any state. Utahns have been putting their money where their mouth is in supporting renewable energy for over a decade.

Like many Utahns, I want the transformation of Utah's electric generation from fossil fuels to renewables, particularly distributed renewables. One scenario is to emphasize solar PV on new and existing structures located near load, reducing transmission losses and the need for additional transmission. A good pairing is distributed PV with electric vehicles as transport and distributed storage

Please retain and expand the Solar Incentive Program, please facilitate the development of distributed renewable generation and distributed storage.
