## Re: Docket No. 08-035-35 – Chehalis/Project Blue – Continuing Confidentiality of Information Provided

Dear Commissioners:

As the Commission is aware, certain information originally provided as confidential in this docket has now been disclosed publicly. This information is restricted to the name of the plant (Chehalis), the name of the parent of the owner of the plant (SUEZ Energy North America), the location of the plant (Lewis County, Washington), the fuel source for the plant (natural gas), the rated capacity of the plant (520 MW), the approximate operational heat rate of the plant (near 6,700 Btu/kWh), the fact that the plant is interconnected with the Bonneville Power Administration transmission system and balancing authority area, and the fact that Rocky Mountain Power intends to use the flexibility of the plant in part to support its owned and purchased wind generation capacity. The Commission and parties no longer need to treat the above information as confidential.

In light of the public disclosure of the foregoing information, confusion may have arisen regarding the confidentiality of other information provided to the Commission and the parties in this docket. This letter confirms that the terms and conditions of the proposed purchase and sale of the plant and associated agreements including the Purchase and Sale Agreement, Rocky Mountain Power's analysis of acquisition of the plant and other confidential due diligence information regarding the plant and its proposed acquisition remains confidential pursuant to the confidentiality agreement between SUEZ Energy North America and the Company and because of the commercial sensitivity of that information. Use of this information is still governed by the terms and conditions of the protective order under which the information was provided.

We trust that the Commission and parties will let us know if any question arises regarding the continuing confidentiality of information previously provided as confidential other than the information specifically mentioned in the first paragraph of this letter.
