Rocky Mountain notified the Committee of its reasons for requesting that the Commission alter the Commission's established schedule in Docket No. 08-035-38. The Committee believes that the October 30th scheduling order efficiently manages the available time and procedural requirements brought about by Rocky Mountain's filing, and in light of the order on the test period and the order addressing the 240-day statutory time limit. As such, the Committee would comply with the schedule established in the Commission's order. In its proposal, Rocky Mountain did not include a corresponding compression of discovery response timeframes. Nonetheless, the Committee would also be able to work within the alternate schedule proposed by the Company if the Commission believes it to be appropriate.
