Beginning January 2009, the City of Taylorsville Storm Water Utility Billing will be on your monthly Rocky Mountain Power Bill. Over the past year, the storm water utility bills have been sent directly to Taylorsville residences each quarter and to businesses each month. The inclusion of the Storm Water Fee on your monthly electric bill is more cost effective and convenient for customers. *for Taylorsville*

Your monthly billing statement issued by Rocky Mountain Power will clearly delineate the portion of your payment that relates to the Taylorsville Storm Water Utility (residential accounts will now be billed \$4.00 per month, instead of \$12.00 quarterly).
