I think the best solution to Utah's power needs is to charge based on a sliding scale.

First, determine how much power each household should be using (say 1.5 kW). Charge everybody some amount (say \$0.05 an hour) for the first 1.5kW they use, then charge \$0.10 for using between 1.5-2kW, and charge \$0.15 for using between 2-2.5kW, and so on.

This would make it so Utahns struggling to get by wouldn't need to have an increase in rates. Also, those who are using more than their share of electricity can save the most by lowering usage, and perhaps an increase in rates will persuade them to be more conservative.
