COMPLAINT TYPE: Rate Increases

COMPLAINT: I understand that RMP is requesting a \$4.25 monthly fee for net metering customers. I am not currently a net metering customer, but this proposed increase is ridiculous. RMP's greed is staggering - they want to pay a discounted rate for power that they will turn around and sell at full price to other customers. Not only that, a move like this discourages clean sources of energy that could have a positive impact on our inversion situation. What is the reason for the 4 percent increase? It's hard for me to believe that they aren't already making plenty of money selling our electricity to California.
