Dear Sirs,

I am in favor is a fully burdened cost approach regarding grid maintenance. Before you allow RMP to charge solar power producers you should have RMP charge more to ALL those customers that have for a long time been elevating the grid maintenance:

- Customers in rural, sparsely populated areas
- Customer, who have always had a very low power consumption
- Customers who heat with natural gas instead of electricity
- Customers who don't drive electric cars
- Customer who depend on power generation which is located 100s of miles away
- Customers who get their power from polluting, fossil fuel generation

Only after you completed these steps you can begin charging those solar power generators for their reduced consumption – and retain your credibility because now you are promoting a fully burdened cost approach across all dimensions, not just solar power generation. In other words, if someone reduces his power consumption by 50% without solar generation, that person should also be charged the same fee because this has the same effect as someone who generates solar power and drives an electric car and thereby uses more power. Isolating solar power is not the right approach.

Get RMP to prove that solar generation really increases grid maintenance compared to all other conservation efforts.

Let's start there to charge all participants for high grid maintenance costs.
