RE: Rocky Mountain Power request to charge a fixed fee for net metering

Net metering as it stands may not be a perfect solution, albeit it is a step in the right direction. Incentivizing those who help offload peak power use is a benefit. The duplicitous statements and actions of power companies like Rocky Mountain Power threaten to derail an otherwise healthy progression for our community, city and state.

Programs like RMP's "Cool Keeper" are designed to offload peak electricity usage as stated on their website, "Once you sign up, a device will be connected to your outdoor central air conditioning unit. On selected weekdays in the summer, we'll automatically coordinate the air conditioners of participating customers in your neighborhood **to help ease the demand for electricity.**" (emphasis added)

Solar production provides value during these same peak periods, day time, hot days where A/C is used frequently. This value cannot be forgotten or left out of RMP equation and cost savings and ease of demand for electricity.

The argument that "Net metering does not fit well with Utah's electrical system" by RMP spokesman David Eskelsen demonstrates a lack of forward thinking, concern for the environment and people of Utah and is more akin to those who want everything to stay how things are rather than making or even allowing progress.

There are numerous studies and briefs that discuss this matter, many of which are already in your hands and being reviewed. If you haven't already, please consider the study from August 2014 about Rethinking Standby and Fixed Cost Charges: Regulatory & Rate Design...

I am adamantly opposed to a set fee for net metering and propose that a more appropriate rate structure be put in place. This decision should not be rushed to but should be thoroughly weighed and provide a long term incentive for Utah residents to invest in solar and netmetering to further the improvement, environmental betterment and conservation in our state. We can be an example to other states and lead the way to a healthier and safer environment. Net metering is one key component to providing this incentive and should not be watered down, reversed or subject to a fee that shortens users payback on their investment.

As a solar energy supplier to Rocky Mountain Power (RMP) I submit this testimony. On the question of the proposal by Rocky Mountain Power to levy an added fee on Solar net metering customers, the answer is quite simple.

Solar power is clean, renewable energy supplied to RMP and the solar capital costs are paid for all or in part by the solar owners. This clean energy displaces dirty fossil fuel energy in this state. To impose an additional fee on solar customers will discourage further solar investment by the people. (Note that all solar customers already pay a minimum connection fee to RMP of \$7 per month) It will condemn Utah to continue to be a dirty energy backwater.

If any thing the PSC should be holding RMP to account for their lack of diligence in planning and developing more solar, wind and geothermal energy replacements for our states over reliance on dirty unhealthy coal energy. Utah gets more than 80% of electrical energy from coal and most of the rest from natural gas. Utah has a goal of getting 20% of energy from renewable sources by 2025. How are we doing?

Other factors to consider:

Much of solar energy generation occurs at peak usage time with high value to RMP.

Solar is clean non polluting energy that reduces the alarmingly bad air quality in the Wasatch region.

Solar is generated locally and excess energy can be used by our neighbors, actually putting less stress on RMP infrastructure.

Reject this fee. Do not send Utah energy policy in the WRONG direction.

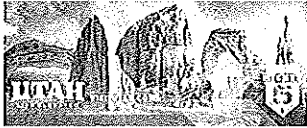
