Dear Sirs.

My wife, Venise, and I wish to register our opposition to the recent proposal filed by Rocky Mountain Power (RMP) with the Utah Public Service Commission which would modify and increase net metering rates for owners of solar panels in Utah. We support private investment in renewable energy especially solar, and we want the benefits of the cleaner, healthier air that results from reduced reliance on fossil fuel-based electricity. RMC's proposal would have just the opposite effect: it would discourage private investment in solar energy, as such action has already done in other states, and it would exacerbate Utah's serious problem of unhealthy air resulting from our unnecessary reliance on fossil fuel-based electricity.

Quoting former Utah State Senator Dan Liljenquist: "Over 8,000 Utah households have purchased and installed rooftop solar units over the past several years. There is clearly high consumer demand for rooftop solar, and the positive externalities of the rooftop solar market, including improved energy self-reliance and environmental cleanliness, are not yet fully understood or quantified. As a result, the Utah Public Service Commission should reject, or at least delay for a period of several years, RMP's new net metering proposal to give the rooftop solar industry a chance to further grow and evolve. Allowing it to do so could usher in a new era of price competition to a market that desperately needs it." The Commission is required to study the costs and benefits of residential solar in Utah. Most states have found that residential solar provides a net benefit to everyone, not just solar customers. Rocky Mountain Power ignores the full benefits and demonstrated cost-savings that they and all Utahns receive from residential solar. Utah deserves an open and transparent cost-benefit study. We call on Governor Herbert, the Utah Legislature, the Utah Public Service Commission, the Utah Division of Public Utilities, and the Utah Office of Consumer Services to reject Rocky Mountain Power's proposal. We ask the Commission to conduct a robust and fair cost-benefit study so that Utah homeowners can continue to invest in solar and energy independence."
