We're interested in getting a roof top solar system, but there has been some question about the net metering agreements since December 9th. I know the commission pushed back the date of discussion to August of 2017, but I've seen conflicting reports of if people like myself purchase a solar system if we will remain grandfathered under the current net metering agreement or if RMP will be allowed to back date whatever they come up with back to December 9th of this year.

Any help you could provide would be very helpful in my decision to invest in rooftop solar. I understand no decision is final until the actual meeting, but even if you could say something like the options below, it would give me the information I need to figure out if I want to move forward or not.

- a) There is no chance we will allow RMP to back date the net metering agreement to before our next meeting in 2017.
- b) It is unlikely that we will allow RMP to back date the net metering agreement before our next meeting in 2017.
