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As a homeowner who has invested in a home solar electric system I follow with interest the proposal from Rocky Mountain Power to drastically change the rate structure for Net Meter type installations.

I am particularly very concerned and opposed to their proposal of an "on-peak demand charge".

This is structured so it does not reflect the actual cost of electricity used during peak demand hours. Rather, **only a single hour of use during an entire month becomes the basis for an entire month's bill. NOT FAIR.**

Moreover, if Rocky Mountain wants to shift to an **on-peak and off-peak rate system, that should be enacted uniformly for all electricity customers on their system, not just net meter customers.**

And if a peak rate system is enacted, then Rocky Mountain should also pay on-peak and off-peak rates to net meter customers for energy their systems produce.

Thus, any changes in the rate system enacted by the PSC must see that **all customers should continue to be treated and billed the same**, whether one is a conventional user of electricity or a user-producer with a solar installation.
