Dear Commissioners,

I urge you not to approve the net metering charges proposed by Rocky Mountain Power in the above docket.

My wife and I are the owners of a Platinum LEED house, which we built in 2010. We have recently installed additional solar panels to make the house essentially net zero and have used net metering since the beginning of 2011.

I have read with interest the Technical Conference presentation by RMP on January 23, 2017 and the Direct Testimony of Dr Jeremy Fisher of June 8, 2017. From these documents I conclude that the power provided by distributed renewable energy is cheaper than that produced by a number of existing coal powered stations even before public health costs are considered. Furthermore, I do not understand the argument put forward by RMP that residential solar power generators are free-riding on the backs of other residential RMP customers. As far as I am aware, rates for all residential customers are essentially "supported" by the big users and I have not heard these users complain about the net metering cost structure for residential distributed energy providers. It appears to me that the RMP argument is purely a public relations exercise in an attempt to create a public backlash against distributed energy providers.

An often quoted technical concern that RMP has is the mismatch in time when solar energy is produced vs the peak demand by electrical customers. The RMP analysis presented on Jan 23rd only considers the demand for residential homes, which I believe is a spurious comparison, since it is the total peak load demanded by all customers (business and residential) that sizes the grid and power generation requirements. I recently spent 10 days in Toronto, where Toronto Hydro has high, medium and low time of day usage charges. Interestingly, high tariff to the consumer is during the day. This is driven by business and manufacturing usage not residential usage and this of course matches the peak generation times of distributed solar.

Toronto Hydro and many other electrical utilities across the world have installed smart meters in all residential homes and have "time of day" charges, which vary seasonally, on all their customers to try and encourage usage behavior that smooths the demand curve throughout the 24 hour day. All utilities of which I am aware apply this charge equally whether the residence has a solar array or not. If time of day or peak load charges are to be used, then all residences should have smart meters installed and the charges should apply equally to all residential customers. Singling out a subset of customers (in this case, the distributed power generators) just because they already have smart meters is iniquitous.

If the amount of distributed power generation becomes an order of magnitude more than it is currently then the technical problems mentioned in the RMP Jan 23rd presentation, such as the need for power conditioning and heavier gauge service wires, will need to be addressed. This can be done by encouraging and providing financial incentives for the installation of batteries at the power generating residences to smooth and control the time and rate at which power is sent back to the grid.

In conclusion, I fully recognize that RMP is a business and as such is entitled to make a profit. However, I urge you to not allow the proposed additional charges outlined in the above docket and hope that you will encourage RMP to develop a tariff system that is fair to all and encourages rather than discourages the development of clean distributed power.
