RECOMMENDATION (Approve)

The Division of Public Utilities (Division) recommends that the Commission approve the limited stay of Schedule 38 requested by Rocky Mountain Power (Company).

ISSUE

On May 22, 2014 Rocky Mountain Power requested stay of the portion of its Schedule 38 tariff that required it to provide indicative pricing to a prospective developer within 30 days of the receiving a request for indicative pricing. The Company requests that the stay remain in effect for 90 days. In an Action Request the Commission asked the Division to comment on the Company's request by June 6, 2014. This memorandum is the Division's response to the Action Request.

As mentioned above, the stay is time limited to 90 days and only for the portion of Schedule 38 requiring that the Company respond within 30 days to a request for indicative pricing. The Company represents that it recently has been overwhelmed with requests for indicative pricing and that it cannot physically comply with all of the requests it has received within the required 30 days. The Company further represents that it should be able to catch up within the requested 90 day stay period and thereafter resume the normal processes set forth in Schedule 38.

Since the stay is both time limited and limited in to this particular part of Schedule 38, the Division believes that the Company's request is reasonable and should be granted.
