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PacifiCorp must cease coal generation by the end of 2019. present facilities must be modified to generate less than half the current power from free-flowing natural gas. Solar must be installed all around all existing facilities. Customers must be to build and send any power they can to the grid with no cost and they must be paid the wholesale rate. All other clean, safe, and non-carbon sources must also be added.
