Rocky Mountain Power's Fossil Fuel Energy Efficiency Standard Plan

On April 29, 2015, pursuant to previous orders of the Public Service Commission of Utah ("Commission") in the above reference docket, the Company filed its 2015 Rocky Mountain Power Fossil Fuel Heat Rate Improvement Plan ("HRIP").

On July 21, 2015, based on the review of the Utah Division of Public Utilities, the Commission concluded the Company's filed HRIP complied with the intent of previous Commission orders. The Commission directed that the Company convene a meeting of interested parties within 60 days of the order to discuss the format and content of future HRIPs.

Pursuant to the order of the Commission, on July 28, 2015 the Company convened a meeting with representatives of the Utah Division of Public Utilities and the Utah Office of Consumer Services. The parties discussed the 2015 HRIP and concluded that the following enhancements will be included in the 2016 HRIP.

- An expanded discussion of specific factors that affect heat rate in CCCTs and measures taken to improve those units.
- An expanded discussion identifying PacifiCorp's coal and gas units with the best heat rates, discussing the availability of those units, and indicating actions that will be taken to improve the availability of those units in the future.
- An expanded discussion of the controllable Heat Rate Management and Improvement parameters identified on page 11 of the 2014 HRIP.

In its order of July 21, 2015 the Commission further directed the Company to file a summary of the meeting within 60 days identifying additional information to be provided in future HRIPs. Subsequent to the July 28, 2015 meeting the summary was prepared and reviewed with the Division of Public Utilities, however, it was inadvertently not sent to the Commission and accordingly is being provided herein.
