Dear Mr. Larsen:

On April 30, 2015, PacifiCorp, dba Rocky Mountain Power in Utah, filed its Demand-Side Management 2014 Energy Efficiency and Peak Load Reduction Report ("2014 DSM Report"). PacifiCorp filed the 2014 DSM Report to comply with the Commission's Order in Docket No. 09-035-27 requiring PacifiCorp to file an annual DSM report by March 31st showing results for the prior year. In Docket No. 12-035-116, the Commission approved permanently moving the required filing date to May 1st.

The Commission received comments on the 2014 DSM Report from the Division of Public Utilities ("Division") on June 1, 2015 and from the Office of Consumer Services ("Office") on June 2, 2015. The Division observes the 2014 DSM Report shows the DSM portfolio passes all of the cost-effectiveness tests and recommends the Commission acknowledge the 2014 DSM Report as complying with Commission reporting requirements. The Office states it reviewed the 2014 DSM Report and noted supporting exhibits were not provided. However, the Office did not identify any reporting deficiencies in the 2014 DSM Report and recommends the Commission acknowledge it as satisfying current reporting requirements.

Based on the Commission's review and the recommendations of the Division and the Office, the Commission acknowledges the 2014 DSM Report complies with relevant Commission orders and reporting requirements.
