The Public Service Commission of Utah (PSC) reviewed the Division of Public Utilities' (DPU) January 23, 2017 memorandum and Audit Report of the Demand Side Management (DSM) Program of Rocky Mountain Power (PacifiCorp) for the Period January 1, 2015 through December 31, 2015 (Program).

The DPU states the intent of its audit was to review the revenues and expenses reported by PacifiCorp for the DSM Program year ending December 2015. According to the DPU, the DSM Program follows good business practices and utilizes adequate and practical accounting and controls. The DPU concludes that, based on a review of PacifiCorp's 2014 DSM tariffs (e.g., Schedule Nos. 105, 110, 111, 114, 117, 118, 140, and 193) and related 2015 filings with the PSC, PacifiCorp appears to be in compliance with regulatory and reporting requirements. No other party commented.

The Commission supports the DPU's efforts to audit PacifiCorp's DSM Program to ensure it is operated in compliance with the PSC's regulatory and reporting requirements, and appreciates the DPU's communication in this matter.
