Dear Mr. Lively:

The Commission reviewed the June 10, 2016 filing by PacifiCorp, doing business as Rocky Mountain Power, requesting Major Event exclusion for the weather-related events occurring on April 30-May 1, 2016. If the request is approved, PacifiCorp indicates it will exclude outage information for these events from its network performance reporting and from customer guarantee failure payments.

The Commission also reviewed the July 11, 2016 action request response from the Division of Public Utilities (Division), detailing its investigation of these events. The Division determined the System Average Interruption Duration Index value of 36.86 minutes for these events exceeded the threshold of 6.06 minutes that defines a Major Event under the method adopted by the Commission in 2005 in Docket No. 98-2035-04. The Division concludes that these events were a Major Event and should be excluded from PacifiCorp's network performance reporting and that PacifiCorp's restoration effort for these events was adequate. The Division recommends the Commission approve PacifiCorp's application for a Major Event exclusion.

Based on the Commission's review of PacifiCorp's filing and the Division's recommendation, PacifiCorp's request for a Major Event exclusion for these events is approved.
