Re: Advice No. 16-01 in Docket No. 16-035-T01, In the Matter of Rocky Mountain Power's Proposed Revisions to Electric Service Schedule No. 118, Low Income Weatherization Program

Dear Mr. Lively,

On January 19, 2016, PacifiCorp, doing business as Rocky Mountain Power, filed Advice No. 16-01 in Docket No. 16-035-T01 proposing revisions to Sheet Nos. 118.3, 118.4, and 118.5 of Electric Service Schedule No. 118, Low Income Weatherization Program. The proposed changes revise the “supplemental” and “additional” energy efficiency measures, clarify electric space heating system requirements, and update administrative sections of the tariff sheets.

On February 3, 2016, the Division of Public Utilities (Division) filed a memorandum recommending the Public Service Commission (Commission) approve the proposed revisions. The Office of Consumer Services (Office) also recommends approval of the revisions with the exception of the addition of smart thermostats with occupancy sensors to the supplemental energy efficiency measures for electrically heated homes. On February 10, 2016, PacifiCorp filed an updated Sheet No. 118.4 removing the language pertaining to smart thermostats.

Based on our review of PacifiCorp’s filings and the Division’s and the Office’s recommendations, the Commission approves the proposed revisions to Sheet Nos. 118.3 and 118.5, as filed on January 19, 2016, and to Sheet No. 118.4, as filed on February 10, 2016, with an effective date of March 1, 2016.
