RE: Proposed Changes to Schedule 73, Subscriber Solar Program Rider

Enclosed for filing are an original and ten (10) copies of proposed tariff sheets associated with Tariff P.S.C.U No. 50 of PacifiCorp, d.b.a. Rocky Mountain Power (the “Company”), applicable to electric service in the State of Utah. Pursuant to the requirement of Rule R746-405-2(D), the Company states that the proposed tariff sheets do not constitute a violation of state law or Commission rule. First Revision of Sheet No. 73.1                      Schedule 73                      Subscriber Solar Program Rider

The purpose of this filing is to propose changes to the Subscriber Solar Program Rider (“Program”) administered through Electric Service Schedule No. 73, specifically to decrease the solar block delivery charge for Schedule 23, as further described below. Proposed changes to the Schedule 73 tariff sheets are included as Exhibit A.

In its order dated October 21, 2015 in this docket the Commission referenced one outstanding issue noted by the Office of Consumer Services (“Office”) related to Electric Service Schedule No. 23 customers opting to participate in Schedule 73. The Commission noted the commitment of the Office to work with the Company to bring forward any necessary changes. Based on further review and discussions with the Office and the Division of Public Utilities, the Company has revised the rates as proposed herein.

The Company proposes to decrease the Schedule 23 solar block delivery charge in Schedule 73 from 2.9294 ¢ per kWh to 2.6958 ¢ per kWh to reflect distribution revenue from the power charge. The Power Charge will still be applicable to customers with usage in excess of 15 kW.
