Gary,

In reviewing our rates relative to possible customer requests regarding our Three Phase Net Metering Rate, we found it necessary to make a modification.

Currently a customer with qualifying renewable generating facilities may elect to be served under a Net Metering Tariff, and in the case of a three phase service, this will be served applying the demand and energy charge depending if the service is under 50 KVA (Non Demand Metered GS-3), or using the Large Power rate if over 50 KVA. The LP rate has a provision that limits the demand charge by comparing the demand reading multiplied by the rate of \$12.00 per kW, or \$.07 multiplied by the kWh, and billing the lesser as the demand component. This provision limits the total charge under the LP rate to not exceed \$.1094 per kWh for demand and energy combined.

While we feel it is proper to maintain the demand charge limitation for a normal Large Power service, it is not for a Large Power Net Metering service, therefore Moon Lake's Board of Directors at the Board Meeting on June 21, 2017 took action to approve the change removing the limitation on the Net Metering 3 Phase Rate. Moon Lake currently has one customer under this rate, Colorado North Western Community College in Rangely Colorado. Their generation facility is very small relative to the total load, and the \$.07 limitation does not come into play, as such their bill is not affected.

Our intention is to include a notice of this rate change in our next newsletter that will be sent to all members in approximately three months.

On May 10, 2017 Moon Lake's Board of Directors changed the policy regarding Line Extensions (Regulation 17). The primary changes were the elimination of the financing option, changes regarding service upgrades, and the elimination of the Pro Rate refund on services applied for after May 10, 2017.

Attached are copies of Regulation 17, and the Tariff Rates. Please notice the change in red under Schedule NM-3. Please let me know if you have any questions or comments.
