Α So you're familiar with the settlement 4 stipulation that culminated from those discussions? 5 6 Α Yes. 7 0 And do you have a summary in support of that stipulation that you would like to give today? 8 Yes, I do. 9 10 Please proceed. 0 11 Good afternoon. On October 5, 2017, the Α 12 Company filed a request for agency action and 13 petition for declaratory ruling, seeking a ruling from the Commission for Kennecott Utah Copper to pay 14 certain charges associated with the 2015 deferral of 15 16 the energy balancing account, or EBA. Over the next several months, the parties held settlement 17 discussions to try to resolve the matter informally. 18 19 And based on those discussions, the Company, 20 Kennecott, and the Division of Public Utilities, 21 agreed to the terms and conditions set forth in the 22 stipulation that was filed February 6, 2018. 23 would also like to note that although the Office of 24 Consumer Services did not sign the stipulation, they 25 also indicated that they do not oppose it.

Page 7 The overall terms of this settlement are 1 2 as follows: Kennecott will pay to the Company 3 \$114,296.36 upon the approval of this stipulation. 4 The remaining balance of \$147,930 will be included as part of the Company's 2018 EBA filing to be 5 collected from Rocky Mountain Power's other EBA 6 customers, which will be filed tomorrow, March 15. 7 The parties agree that the stipulation is in the 8 9 public interest. I was involved in the settlement 10 11 discussions and I believe the stipulation is in the 12 public interest for the following reasons: First, 13 it resolves a dispute and allows the parties to use their time and resources for other matters. 14 15 resources necessary to continue to litigate this 16 matter may have already surpassed the disputed amounts in this case. 17 Second, it offers a reasonable resolution 18 19 of the responsibility for prudently incurred costs. 20 The settlement essentially splits the costs between 21 Kennecott and the Company's other EBA customers. 2.2 And last, it resolves the case through settlement which is consistent with the Commission's 23 24 laws, which encourage informal resolution of 25 disputes.

1	Page 8 The Company appreciates and would like to
2	thank the parties for working together to reach this
3	agreement. This stipulation represents good faith
4	efforts in resolving the dispute between the Company
5	and Kennecott that has been going on since January
6	of 2017, and I respectfully recommend that the
7	Commission approve it as filed.
8	MS. HOGLE: Thank you. The witness
9	is available for questions.
10	OFFICER HAMMER: Ms. Schmid?
11	MS. SCHMID: No questions.
12	OFFICER HAMMER: Thank you.
13	Ms. Hogle, any other witnesses?

Page 9 BY MS. SCHMID: 1 2 Q Please state your name, title, employer, 3 and business address for the record. 4 My name is Charles E. Peterson. utility technical consultant with the Division of 5 Public Utilities, and my address is 160 East 300 6 South, Salt Lake City, Utah, Fourth Floor. 7 8 Q Thank you. In connection with your employment by the Division, have you participated on 9 behalf of the Division in this docket? 10 11 Α Yes. 12 Are you familiar with the terms of the 13 settlement agreement that is presented to the 14 Commission? 15 Α Yes. 16 Do you have any comments that you would 0 17 like to make? Just very briefly, the Division did 18 participate. We think of ourselves in this case as 19 2.0 being a facilitator more than a party in this 21 dispute between Kennecott and the Company. We participated -- "we," meaning the Division --22 23 participated in the settlement discussion that is referenced in the stipulation. And the Division is 24 25 familiar with the terms of the settlement, and it

     The settlement includes Kennecott as being -- should

     have been a participant in the EBA. Consequently,
23
     customers were overcompensated in the refund that
24
     was made. And given the symmetry that the Division

     believes is appropriate in this case -- that is, if
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Page 11 the company, if Kennecott, were to be charged for 1 2 EBA amounts in 2015, it should participate in -- it 3 should have participated in the refund up through 4 the end of November 2016, when its new contract went into effect. And that is the -- that resulted in 5 the ratepayers being on the hook, so to speak, in 6 2018 for some additional EBA funding. 7 8 OFFICER HAMMER: Thank you. That's 9 helpful. Is there anything else? 10 MS. HOGLE: No, that is it, other 11 than given that there are no disputes or challenges 12 to the parties' settlement agreement, perhaps it 13 would be reasonable to request a bench order. 14 you. 15 OFFICER HAMMER: I can see if I can 16 wrangle a quorum of commissioners. I didn't expect a request for a bench ruling, but I'll see what I 17 18 can do. So we'll stand in recess for ten minutes, 19 and I'll see if I can gather them up. Thank you. 2.0 (A brief recess was taken.) 21 OFFICER HAMMER: Thank you, everyone, 2.2 for coming in this afternoon. Based on the 23 Commission's review of the stipulation and the testimony presented at hearing today, the PSC finds 24 the stipulation is just and reasonable in result, 25

2	been confirmed by a quorum of commissioners and will
3	be memorialized by written order. Is there anything

6	clarification. Does that also mean that the
