Power to Establish Export Credits for Customer Generated Electricity

Comments on Joint Reply to the Public Service Commission's January 25,

2019 Order

On January 25, 2019, the Public Service Commission of Utah ("Commission") issued an Order Denying Joint Motion to Amend Scheduling Order and Granting Request for Technical Assistance ("Order") requiring Utah Clean Energy, Vote Solar, Vivint Solar, the Utah Solar Energy Association, and Auric Solar (collectively, the "Moving Parties") to make a filing within 30 days to a) identify the appropriate Lawrence Berkeley National Laboratory ("LBNL") staff member to whom the Technical Assistance ("TA") Request Form should be sent, and b) complete the TA Request Form, which was attached to the Order. On February 21, 2019, the Moving Parties filed a proposed TA Request Form. The Order provided for a comment period on the Moving Parties submission within 15 days of the filing. Rocky Mountain Power ("Company") hereby submits comments on the Moving Parties' TA Request Form.

Rocky Mountain Power's Response to the Moving Parties' Proposed Technical Assistance Form

Generally, the Moving Parties' request in the "Electricity Policy Technical Assistance Program" TA Request Form is beyond the scope of what should reasonably be considered in this proceeding. Although the requested technical assistance will be presented in an informal workshop that will not be used to set the parameters or scope of the evidence to be presented in the formal evidentiary proceeding, it should nevertheless be limited to a few topics that can be sufficiently covered in one day. The long list of topics outlined by the Moving Parties is too expansive and not sufficiently focused enough to be of much value to the parties. The Company also notes that the list of proposed topics includes subject areas that were evaluated in the numerous workshops that were held in this proceeding's predecessor docket (Docket No. 14-035-114).

In addition, the Key Tasks and Deliverables section at the end of the TA Request Form indicates June 30, 2019, as a proposed date for the Technical Workshop, which is a Sunday. The Company assumes this is an oversight by the Moving Parties, and recommends the Moving
