Dear Utah Public Service Commission,

I installed a 15kwH solar panel array with back up battery system. This doubled my monthly electrical costs.

Rocky Mountain Power will only reimburse me \$.047/kwh generated average per annum (June through September inclusive 5.160¢ per kWh for all exported kWh; October through May inclusive 4.462¢ per kWh). About \$72 a month reimbursement.

At the same time, I'm paying RMP \$.092/kwh generated average per annum by them. About \$89 a month I still have to pay RMP.

My acquisition costs alone are \$6.9/kwh generated per annum. (\$220 per month loan payment) Why is there not at least parity (equal reimbursement) for Consumer Generated electricity vs RMP generated electricity? Whatever happened to the Equal Protection Clause of the 14th Amendment of US Constitution?

Why are individual citizens' interests always secondary to deep pocket corporate donors' & their "captured" Administrative State's interests?
