Good morning,,

We moved to West Jordan after 17 years in Draper. We owned solar panels that generated most of our electricity and paid a reasonable connection fee to Rocky Mountain Power. The total cost of the system was recovered in eight years. We installed a larger system in West Jordan which produces more than previous but Public Service Commission tariffs have changed significantly. We receive about five cents for every kWh sold to Rocky Mountain Power but are charged about 10 cents for each kWh we buy back. We will invest more money to install batteries to prevent selling power back. We were shocked at the unfavorable decisions that have gone into the changes to disadvantage the consumer and support big-power.
