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APPEARANCES

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1 PROCEEDINGS

2 OFFICER REIF: Good morning. I'm  
3 Melanie Reif. I am the administrative law judge and  
4 hearing officer for this case. And this is the  
5 scheduled hearing in Docket No. 17-035-71. This  
6 matter is entitled: Application of Rocky Mountain  
7 Power for Approval of Electric Service Agreement and  
8 Operating Reserves Agreement between PacifiCorp and  
9 US Magnesium, LLC. Let's start first by taking  
10 appearances, please. Starting with PacifiCorp.

11 MR. MCDERMOTT: This is  
12 Jacob McDermott on behalf of Rocky Mountain Power.

13 OFFICER REIF: Welcome.

14 MR. JETTER: Good morning.  
15 Justin Jetter with the Utah Attorney General's  
16 Office, representing the Utah Division of Public  
17 Utilities. And with me at counsel table is Jeff  
18 Einfeldt.

19 OFFICER REIF: Thank you.

20 MR. SNARR: Good morning. My name is  
21 Steven Snarr. I'm an Assistant Attorney General  
22 representing the Office of Consumer Services, and  
23 with me today is Cheryl Murray.

24 OFFICER REIF: Thank you and welcome.  
25 Just a quick reminder before I turn to Mr. Dodge.

1 Make sure your microphone is not only on but  
2 somewhere near your face, it will make it much  
3 easier for me to hear you and those in the room.

4 Mr. Dodge, good morning.

5 MR. DODGE: Good morning. Gary Dodge  
6 on behalf of US Magnesium, LLC, and Roger Swenson  
7 is here at the table with me.

8 OFFICER REIF: Good morning.  
9 Welcome. Before we get started this morning,  
10 Mr. McDermott, I wanted to make something very clear  
11 before we begin the hearing. And that is, as it  
12 relates to the reply comments that were filed by  
13 US Magnesium, the Commission is very aware that  
14 there is a separate docket pending in this before  
15 the Commission. And to that end, the Commission  
16 will not be making any indication as to how we  
17 intend to resolve that matter in this hearing, but  
18 we do wish to note that we are aware of that pending  
19 matter and we anticipate that it will be resolved in  
20 the coming weeks.

21 So with that said, our understanding  
22 is that we have an ESA application that is pending  
23 before the hearing -- before the Commission, and  
24 that is what we intend to hear today. So if that is  
25 what you understand as well and PacifiCorp has filed

1 such an ESA, that's what we intend to review.

2 MR. DODGE: May I ask a question on  
3 that issue or at least, raise an issue that is of  
4 concern to US Mag? We completely agree with Your  
5 Honor's statement that the tax docket is the  
6 appropriate docket for that to be revolved in. The  
7 problem we have is that there are statements in that  
8 docket that could be interpreted to say that unless  
9 the tax issue is expressly dealt with in the energy  
10 services agreement, it shouldn't be -- the reduction  
11 shouldn't be passed on to US Mag. There is no ESA  
12 today going forward, and US Mag would prefer to have  
13 this matter continued so that it can negotiate,  
14 attempt to negotiate, such an amendment if it needs  
15 to be in the contract expressly. Or we would ask  
16 the Commission to expressly rule that the fact --  
17 that the language in the agreement itself is enough  
18 to have the merits of that issue decided in the tax  
19 docket. In other words, the ESA itself says any  
20 other charges or credits will be decided by the  
21 Commission in an appropriate document. We simply  
22 don't want to get whipsawed with this being approved  
23 and then someone arguing in the next docket that  
24 because it doesn't expressly say "taxes," that the  
25 tax credit should not go there. I think that's a

1 fairly -- I think that's a crazy argument to make to  
2 be honest, but we're fearful that could be made.

3 OFFICER REIF: Mr. Dodge, thank you.  
4 And just to sum up, reiterate, what I've already  
5 said, we don't intend in any way to make an  
6 indication today either implicitly or explicitly how  
7 the Commission intends to address the pending  
8 docket. And to that end, if the parties wish to  
9 postpone this matter, that certainly is within your  
10 purview. And if you would like some time to discuss  
11 that, I would happily step out of the room if you  
12 want to discuss that privately and --

13 MR. DODGE: We would make a motion --  
14 we'll discuss it privately -- to continue this  
15 hearing until some time near the end of the month.

16 OFFICER REIF: Okay.

17 MR. DODGE: And I'm happy to talk and  
18 if they're not in agreement, we will still ask for  
19 that.

20 OFFICER REIF: Okay. You do realize  
21 that the application is pending -- or at least the  
22 Commission does realize that the application is  
23 pending by application of Rocky Mountain Power. So  
24 with that said, we'll be in recess and if you could  
25 kindly just let me know when you're ready to



1 commence, I'll come back in and take care of  
2 whatever needs to be taken care of at that point.  
3 Mr. McDermott? Is everybody on board with that?  
4 Okay. Very good.

5 (A brief recess was taken.)

6 OFFICER REIF: Mr. Dodge?

7 MR. DODGE: Your Honor, we've had  
8 some very good discussions and the parties, I think,  
9 have resolved our concern -- well, the parties have  
10 resolved the concern, and I'd like to state what the  
11 resolution is and then the other parties can  
12 obviously indicate whether I've stated it right.  
13 The parties have agreed that the language in the ESA  
14 that's before the Commission for approval today,  
15 which includes the reference to other credits and  
16 surcharges, et cetera, will be applied to US  
17 Magnesium only if the Commission decides it in an  
18 appropriate docket, and that the appropriate docket  
19 for determining that is the tax docket, and that  
20 there won't be an argument that, because that  
21 language doesn't expressly refer to taxes, that  
22 somehow that's not included. So it will be decided  
23 on the merits in the tax docket, as opposed to based  
24 on some argument that had to have been in the ESA  
25 specifically. I hope that makes sense.

1 OFFICER REIF: And that resolves your  
2 concern?

3 MR. DODGE: It does.

4 OFFICER REIF: Mr. McDermott, is that  
5 your understanding?

6 MR. MCDERMOTT: That's my  
7 understanding. The company's position is that the  
8 tax docket is the appropriate docket to consider  
9 whether those surcharges -- or whether those credits  
10 are appropriate for US Magnesium under this  
11 agreement.

12 OFFICER REIF: Very good.  
13 Mr. Jetter.

14 MR. JETTER: I would say yes, that  
15 also reflects our understanding of what we have  
16 agreed to and having just a record today that will,  
17 sort of, memorialize -- though it's a strange way to  
18 do it, I think it's worthwhile because of the  
19 timing, short timing, that reflects -- primarily the  
20 Division agrees that that's an appropriate way to go  
21 forward.

22 OFFICER REIF: Thank you. Mr. Snarr.

23 MR. SNARR: The Office concurs with  
24 the explanation provided.

25 OFFICER REIF: Thank you. Okay. So

1 if I am tracking this correctly, we are ready to  
2 proceed on the ESA application; is that correct?

3 MR. MCDERMOTT: That is correct.

4 OFFICER REIF: All right. Well,  
5 Mr. McDermott, this is your application, so you have  
6 the floor.

7 MR. MCDERMOTT: The Company would  
8 like to call Kyle Moore to testify.

9 OFFICER REIF: Good morning,  
10 Mr. Moore. Would you like to testify from where you  
11 are?

12 MR. MOORE: Yes, that would be fine.

13 OFFICER REIF: Okay. So I'll swear  
14 you in.

15 KYLE MOORE,  
16 having been first duly sworn to tell the truth, was  
17 examined and testified as follows:

18 BY MR. MCDERMOTT:

19 Q Mr. Moore, please state your name,  
20 business address, and title.

21 A My name is Kyle Moore. I'm a power  
22 marketer originator for Rocky Mountain Power, and my  
23 business address is 1407 West North Temple Street.

24 Q Thank you. And did you work on the  
25 contract, the ESA contract, with US Magnesium, LLC?

1 A Yes, I did.

2 Q And did you prepare a summary of testimony  
3 for us today?

4 A Yes, I did.

5 Q Please proceed.

6 A I present today for Commission approval an  
7 electric service agreement between US Magnesium,  
8 LLC, or US Mag, and Rocky Mountain Power, or the  
9 Company.

10 On November 15, 2017, the Commission  
11 issued an order approving a stipulation and  
12 settlement agreement filed by Rocky Mountain Power  
13 to extend the previous contract's term through  
14 April 30, 2018. The stipulating parties included  
15 Rocky Mountain Power, the Office of Consumer  
16 Services, or the Office, and the Division of Public  
17 Utilities, or the Division. In an application dated  
18 December 29, 2017, Rocky Mountain Power filed for an  
19 approval of a new electric service agreement, or  
20 ESA, with US Mag. The Company now seeks approval of  
21 this ESA. The effective date of this new agreement  
22 is May 1, 2018, and the Company requests the  
23 Commission approve this new ESA prior to the  
24 expiration of the current ESA, by April 30, 2018.

25 US Mag has an interruptible customer of

1 the Company for many years. The specific structure  
2 and terms of the electric service agreements between  
3 the parties have varied somewhat over the years, but  
4 the interruptible nature of the contract has been  
5 constant. The structure and terms of the new ESA  
6 are similar to those found in the existing  
7 agreement, which was approved by the Commission on  
8 January 28, 2015, in Docket No. 14-035-143.

9 The new ESA has a two-year term covering  
10 calendar years 2018 and 2019, with one automatic  
11 one-year extension through the end of 2020, unless  
12 either party gives 180 days notice to terminate at  
13 the end of the initial term. The rates in the new  
14 ESA are equivalent to the approved rates as of  
15 December 31, 2017, from the previous contract. Rate  
16 changes for US Mag will occur consistent with the  
17 results of any general rate case or a major plant  
18 addition case in the state of Utah and will be tied  
19 to the average percent change for all Utah retail  
20 customers.

21 The cost of service study used to set  
22 US Mag's rate accounts for the interruptible rights  
23 set forth in the agreement for the purpose of  
24 reducing peak demand. The new agreement also  
25 includes interruptible provisions similar to the

1 existing agreement in which the Company is allowed  
2 to interrupt US Mag's load in the summer months  
3 based on the day-ahead temperature forecast and in  
4 the winter months, regardless of temperature. For  
5 the winter months of December and January, the  
6 Company has the right to curtail US Mag for two  
7 blocks of two hours each for a total of four hours  
8 each weekday. For the summer months of June through  
9 September, the Company has the right to curtail  
10 US Mag for up to four consecutive hours each weekday  
11 if the day-ahead forecasted temperature at the Salt  
12 Lake City International Airport exceeds certain  
13 triggers set forth in the ESA.

14 The Company can also bank curtailment  
15 hours during times when interruption is allowed by  
16 the agreement but not needed by the Company and then  
17 use those banked hours during times when  
18 interruption is not otherwise allowed by the  
19 agreement, but the Company deems interruption is  
20 needed for operational flexibility. When provided  
21 with a notice to curtail, US Mag may elect to either  
22 physically curtail or to buy through market prices  
23 if energy is available.

24 On March 12, 2018, the DPU issued its  
25 report in which it recommends approval of the ESA

1 while stating that it will be looking at a cost of  
2 service study in the next rate case to inform its  
3 decisions regarding any future ESA US Mag and Rocky  
4 Mountain Power.

5 On March 12, 2018, the OCS issued its  
6 report in which it recommends approval of the ESA  
7 with the following conditions, to which Rocky  
8 Mountain Power has no objections: The Company will  
9 provide to the Office and the Division, US Mag's  
10 annual report on energy efficiency projects;  
11 US Magnesium will continue to be subject to  
12 Schedule 98 REC revenue adjustment.

13 The Company represents the terms and  
14 conditions in the US Mag ESA are just and reasonable  
15 and in the public interest, therefore the Company  
16 recommends and requests that the Commission approve  
17 the ESA.

18 MR. MCDERMOTT: Thank you. No  
19 further questions.

20 OFFICER REIF: Mr. Jetter.

21 MR. JETTER: I have no questions.

22 OFFICER REIF: You don't wish to put  
23 on a -- do you have any questions?

24 MR. JETTER: I do not.

25 OFFICER REIF: Okay. I'm sorry.

1 Mr. Snarr, do you have any questions?

2 MR. SNARR: We have no  
3 cross-examination.

4 OFFICER REIF: Mr. Dodge?

5 MR. DODGE: No, thank you.

6 OFFICER REIF: My apologies.

7 Mr. Jetter, back to you. Do you wish to put on a  
8 witness?

9 MR. JETTER: I do, your Honor. Thank  
10 you. The Division would like to have sworn in  
11 Mr. Jeff Einfeldt.

12 OFFICER REIF: Mr. Einfeldt, good  
13 morning. I'm assuming you wish to give your  
14 testimony from where you are?

15 MR. EINFELDT: Yes.

16 OFFICER REIF: Okay. So I'll go  
17 ahead and swear you in.

18 JEFFREY S. EINFELDT,  
19 having been first duly sworn to tell the truth, was  
20 examined and testified as follows:

21 BY MR. JETTER:

22 Q Mr. Einfeldt, would you please state your  
23 name and occupation for the record?

24 A My name is Jeffrey S. Einfeldt. I am  
25 currently employed by the Division of Public



1 Utilities as a utilities analyst. My business  
2 address is 160 East 200 South, fourth floor.

3 **Q Thank you. Did you file or create and**  
4 **cause to be filed with the Commission, comments from**  
5 **the Division of Public Utilities dated March 12,**  
6 **2018?**

7 A Yes.

8 **Q And does the recommendation and the**  
9 **comments included in that document still reflect the**  
10 **Division's position?**

11 A Yes.

12 **Q Have you prepared a brief statement?**

13 A Yes, very brief.

14 **Q Please, go ahead.**

15 A The Division reviewed Rocky Mountain  
16 Power's filing in this docket. We met with Rocky  
17 Mountain Power staff to go over the calculations  
18 supporting the proposed agreement, and the Division  
19 has reviewed those calculations and is satisfied  
20 that they were done correctly. The Division  
21 compared the proposed ESA with the current ESA  
22 between Rocky Mountain Power and US Magnesium and  
23 found no material changes between the two  
24 agreements.

25 The Division recommends that the

1 Commission approve the proposed ESA as just and  
2 reasonable and in the public interest. That  
3 concludes my comments.

4 MR. JETTER: Thank you. I have no  
5 further questions.

6 OFFICER REIF: Thank you.  
7 Mr. McDermott, do you have any questions of the  
8 witness?

9 MR. MCDERMOTT: No questions. Thank  
10 you.

11 OFFICER REIF: Mr. Snarr?

12 MR. SNARR: No questions.

13 OFFICER REIF: Mr. Dodge?

14 MR. DODGE: No questions.

15 OFFICER REIF: Okay. Mr. Snarr.

16 MR. SNARR: Yes. On behalf of the  
17 Office of Consumer Services, we would like to  
18 present Cheryl Murray as a witness to state our  
19 position. Could she be sworn?

20 CHERYL MURRAY,  
21 having been first duly sworn to tell the truth, was  
22 examined and testified as follows:

23 BY MR. SNARR:

24 Q Please state your name, address, and who  
25 you represent.

1           A     My name is Cheryl Murray. My business  
2 address is 160 East 300 South, Salt Lake City. And  
3 I'm testifying on behalf of the Officer of Consumer  
4 Services.

5           **Q     Did you prepare and submit to the**  
6 **Commission a memo dated March 12, 2018, consisting**  
7 **of six pages?**

8           A     Yes. I filed both confidential and  
9 redacted versions providing the Office's position on  
10 the proposed US Magnesium electric service  
11 agreement.

12          **Q     And do you adopt those comments as your**  
13 **testimony today?**

14          A     Yes.

15          **Q     Do you have a brief statement that would**  
16 **summarize the Office's position?**

17          A     Yes, I do.

18          **Q     Could you please provide that?**

19          A     Yes, thank you. In a March 12 memo, the  
20 Office stated its position regarding the ESA between  
21 Rocky Mountain Power and US Magnesium. Important  
22 considerations for the Office were the timing of  
23 future rate adjustments and surcharges to which  
24 US Magnesium would be subject, which the Office  
25 asserts are appropriate elements of the ESA.

1           The Office also identified two issues that  
2 we recommended be made conditions for approval of  
3 the ESA. In reply comments filed on April 5, 2018,  
4 US Magnesium agreed to one of the conditions,  
5 however the condition to which it agreed was not  
6 identified. Today in his summary, Mr. Moore  
7 indicates that Rocky Mountain Power agrees to both  
8 conditions. Therefore, the Office recommends that  
9 the Commission approve the ESA between Rocky  
10 Mountain Power and US Magnesium with those two  
11 conditions and that any approval order specifically  
12 include those conditions. That concludes my  
13 comments.

14           MR. SNARR: Ms. Murray is available  
15 for questions.

16           OFFICER REIF: Thank you. Any  
17 questions of the witness, Mr. McDermott?

18           MR. MCDERMOTT: No, thank you. No  
19 questions from the Company.

20           OFFICER REIF: Mr. Jetter?

21           MR. JETTER: No, thank you.

22           OFFICER REIF: Mr. Dodge?

23           MR. DODGE: No questions.

24           OFFICER REIF: Thank you, Ms. Murray.  
25 Mr. Dodge.

1 MR. DODGE: Thank you, Your Honor.

2 Roger Swenson is available to testify, but unless  
3 Your Honor or other counsel have questions, we don't  
4 feel the need to put him on. I would like to state  
5 that in our reply comments we address primarily the  
6 tax issue that we dealt with at the beginning of the  
7 hearing, and I would like to confirm that it was  
8 US Mag's intent to agree with both of the conditions  
9 the Office proposed. So US Mag does agree with both  
10 of those conditions being included in the order.  
11 Sorry, we said one instead of two. We meant both.  
12 Thank you.

13 OFFICER REIF: And does US Magnesium  
14 wish to make any statement as to the just and  
15 reasonable nature of the agreement?

16 MR. DODGE: We're happy to do that,  
17 if you think that would be useful.

18 OFFICER REIF: I'm not forcing you.

19 MR. DODGE: Let's ask Mr. Swenson.

20 OFFICER REIF: Mr. Swenson, good  
21 morning. I'm going to swear you in before you  
22 testify.

23 ROGER SWENSON,  
24 having been first duly sworn to tell the truth, was  
25 examined and testified as follows:

1 BY MR. DODGE:

2 Q Mr. Swenson, tell us who you are and why  
3 you're here?

4 A My name is Roger Swenson. My address is  
5 1592 East 3350 South, Salt Lake City, Utah. I am  
6 the energy consultant for US Magnesium.

7 Q Were you responsible for negotiating on  
8 behalf of US Magnesium the ESA before the Commission  
9 for approval?

10 A Yes. That is one of my responsibilities  
11 with US Magnesium, is to interact with Rocky  
12 Mountain Power and negotiate the terms and  
13 conditions of the agreement.

14 Q And can you state your opinion on your  
15 position, US Mag's position, on whether the contract  
16 is fair and just and reasonable?

17 A We believe that we negotiated in good  
18 faith and came to terms that were just and  
19 reasonable and in the public interest.

20 MR. DODGE: Thank you. No further  
21 questions.

22 OFFICER REIF: Thank you.  
23 Mr. McDermott, do you have any questions of the  
24 witness?

25 MR. MCDERMOTT: No questions. Thank

1 you.

2 OFFICER REIF: Mr. Jetter?

3 MR. JETTER: No questions.

4 OFFICER REIF: Mr. Snarr?

5 MR. SNARR: No questions.

6 OFFICER REIF: And no questions from  
7 the Commission. So is there anything else that any  
8 of the parties wish to address this morning?

9 MR. MCDERMOTT: Are you prepared to  
10 rule from the bench on the approval of the contract  
11 today?

12 OFFICER REIF: Are you making a  
13 motion?

14 MR. MCDERMOTT: I am making a motion  
15 for a bench order.

16 OFFICER REIF: Okay. We'll take that  
17 under consideration and I will return momentarily.  
18 Thank you. Is there any objection to the motion  
19 before we take a recess? Okay.

20 (A brief recess was taken.)

21 OFFICER REIF: There's been a motion  
22 for a bench order to approve the ESA that's pending  
23 before the Commission. And in reviewing the  
24 request, the Commission so grants the motion and  
25 approves the ESA based on the testimony today, which

1 has indicated that there are no outstanding issues.  
2 The requests from the Office have been resolved and  
3 each of the witnesses has testified that the  
4 agreement is just, reasonable, and in the public  
5 interest. Based on the record before the Commission  
6 and the application, and there being no objection,  
7 we approve the ESA and will put our order in a  
8 written order shortly after this hearing.

9 So thank you very much, and have a  
10 good rest of the day.

11 (The hearing concluded at 10:40 a.m.)

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
