Dear Mr. Laub:

The Public Service Commission of Utah (PSC) reviewed the July 19, 2017 filing by Dixie Escalante Rural Electric Association, doing business as Dixie Power (Dixie), of an increase to the Facilities Service Charge in its Utah residential and small commercial service schedules, and an increase to the Demand Charge in its Utah commercial and off-peak service schedules, effective September 1, 2017. The PSC also reviewed the August 1, 2017 action request response filed by the Division of Public Utilities (DPU). The DPU states that Dixie's Board approved the proposed changes on April 6, 2017. The DPU also states Dixie mailed notices to its members of the proposed tariff changes on May 15, 2017 prior to public meetings held on May 30, 2017 in Beryl, Utah and May 31, 2017 in St. George, Utah. The DPU recommends the PSC acknowledge Dixie's tariff changes.

Based on the PSC's review of the filing and the DPU's comments, the PSC acknowledges the filing as complying with Utah Code Ann. § 54-7-12(7). Accordingly, it is available for public inspection at the PSC.

¹ While Dixie's filing cover letter states that "[t]he residential rate includes an increase in the Facilities Service Charge of \$6 from \$19 to \$25 and the commercial rates included a demand charge increase of \$1 per kW from \$9 to \$10 per kW," the revised tariff sheets also include the following changes not specifically mentioned in the cover letter: 1) a \$6 increase (from \$19 to \$25 per month) in the Facilities Service Charge for Small Commercial Service (0-60 Amps); 2) a \$5 increase (from \$25 to \$30 per month) in the Facilities Service Charge for Small Commercial Service (50 kW Maximum); and 3) a \$1 increase (from \$4 to \$5 per kW-month) in the Demand Charge for Off-Peak Service (2499 kW Maximum).
