2	OFFICER REIF: Good morning,
3	everyone. I'm Melanie Reif, and I am serving as the
4	presiding officer for the Utah Public Service
5	Commission today. This is the formal complaint of
6	Kristy Buchanan against Rocky Mountain Power, Docket
7	No. 18-035-29.
8	We're holding this hearing today as a
9	result of the complaint that Ms. Buchanan filed and
10	the request that she made for a hearing in
11	relationship to the motion to dismiss that was filed
12	by Rocky Mountain Power. So at this point, for the
13	record, I'd like to take appearances. And let's
14	start with Rocky Mountain Power, and I'd like to
15	note for the record at this time that Ms. Buchanan
16	is not here, and there appears to be no one here on
17	her behalf. So I'll allow you to make your
18	appearances, and if for some reason Ms. Buchanan
19	appears, we'll move to her next. Thank you.
20	MR. SOLANDER: Good morning,
21	Officer Reif. Daniel Solander representing Rocky
22	Mountain Power. I have with me at counsel table,
23	our witness, Autumn Braithwaite, and also with me is
24	Rob Stewart and Jana Saba.
25	OFFICER REIF: Good morning to you

1	Page 5 all. All right. Well, given that Ms. Buchanan is
2	not here and has not appeared in the few moments
3	between my last statement, Mr. Solander, why don't I
4	let you go ahead and proceed with your witness.
5	MR. SOLANDER: Thank you. I do
6	believe that we are limited the hearing is
7	limited only to the notice that Ms. Buchanan
8	received; is that correct? Is that all you want us
9	to discuss, or do you want us to the order
10	setting the hearing
11	OFFICER REIF: Yes, sir.
12	MR. SOLANDER: said that it was
13	limited just to the notice that Ms. Buchanan did or
14	didn't receive in June?
15	OFFICER REIF: Yes, that's correct.
16	MR. SOLANDER: I guess then we'll
17	call Ms. Braithwaite to the stand.
18	OFFICER REIF: Ms. Braithwaite, good
19	morning. Do you wish to give your testimony from
20	where you're seated today?
21	MS. BRAITHWAITE: Sure.
22	AUTUMN BRAITHWAITE,
23	having been first duly sworn to tell the truth, was
24	examined and testified as follows:

1	Page 6 BY MR. SOLANDER:
2	Q Good morning, Ms. Braithwaite.
3	A Good morning.
4	Q Could you please describe your first
5	experience or interaction with Ms. Buchanan?
6	A I had actually spoken to Ms. Buchanan
7	after the formal complaint was filed, and she had a
8	number of concerns regarding a payment arrangement,
9	not so much the notices on her account. We were
10	able to confirm during that conversation that she is
11	set up to receive paperless billings, which are
12	statements that are emailed to her. The email
13	address we have on file is correct, none of the
14	email addresses or the emails that we have sent
15	have been returned to us as undeliverable, and
16	Ms. Buchanan also verified she was able to log in
17	and see her statements online.
18	Q And approximately how much is Ms. Buchanan
19	delinquent on her account at this point?
20	A As of today, the balance owing is \$2,364.
21	Q And have you been able to agree in
22	principle with Ms. Buchanan on a payment plan?
23	A Yes.
24	Q And can you describe the terms of that
25	arrangement?

Page 7 1 Α Ms. Buchanan has agreed to pay \$150 a month and then when she gets her tax refund check 2 3 next year in March, she will go ahead and -- we gave 4 a little bit more time, so the agreement is whatever the remaining balance is owing on her account in 5 April 2019, she will pay in full by the end of 6 7 April. And have you contacted Ms. Buchanan to 8 Q 9 attempt to get her to sign a stipulation dismissing this complaint? 10 11 Α Yes. 12 Q And have those attempts been successful? 13 Α No. 14 MR. SOLANDER: Thank you. That 15 concludes Ms. Braithwaite's testimony. I do have a copy of the notices that we've sent to Ms. Buchanan 16 beginning in June, if I could enter that as Exhibit 17 18 1. May I approach? 19 OFFICER REIF: Does it relate to the 2.0 notice -- her notice? 21 MR. SOLANDER: It does. It has a 2.2 computer printout of what Ms. Buchanan has been 23 receiving for June, July, the end of July, and 24 August 31st. It does not cover the balance to date, 25 but it covers the notices that she's received over

1	the past several months.
2	OFFICER REIF: Okay. And it would
3	include the billing notice for June of 2018?
4	MR. SOLANDER: Correct.
5	OFFICER REIF: Sure. Please.
6	(Exhibit No. 1 admitted.)
7	OFFICER REIF: Thank you. And
8	Mr. Solander, would you go through each one of these
9	and for the record, explain what this information
10	MR. SOLANDER: I'll have
11	Ms. Braithwaite do that.
12	MS. BRAITHWAITE: So what these are,
13	the email where it says, "Dear Customer," this would
14	have been the email she would have received to her
15	email address to indicate that her bill is ready to
16	be viewed, and the printout below is really what the
17	system would show on our end just to verify that the
18	email was sent.
19	OFFICER REIF: May I interrupt for
20	one minute just to make sure that I'm looking at the
21	right document, because these appear to be very
22	similar to one another. The box at the bottom of
23	the page on each of the documents has a date of
24	October 24th, 2018, which was yesterday's date. So
25	help me understand when or if Ms. Buchanan

1	Page 9 received this, when she would have received this.
2	MS. BRAITHWAITE: The box below was
3	actually generated yesterday for the hearing, and so
4	that's why the date appears at the top of the box.
5	OFFICER REIF: Okay.
6	MS. BRAITHWAITE: In the graph below
7	that, it should show a "Sent To" email address, and
8	then below that, "Created On," and that would be the
9	day the email was sent to her.
10	OFFICER REIF: Okay. So the first
11	one I'm looking at has a date of 5/11?
12	MS. BRAITHWAITE: Yes.
13	OFFICER REIF: Okay. So that
14	predates her concern about the June 2018 bill?
15	MS. BRAITHWAITE: Yes. We just
16	wanted to show the statements prior to that and
17	after that.
18	OFFICER REIF: Okay.
19	MS. BRAITHWAITE: So it should
20	reflect May, June, and July.
21	OFFICER REIF: Okay. I'm sorry. I
22	didn't mean to interrupt your flow, so please go
23	ahead.
24	MS. BRAITHWAITE: Just to reflect
25	that the emails continued to be sent to Ms. Buchanan
