Re: *Advice Letter No. 19-10, Rocky Mountain Power's Proposed Tariff Revisions to Electric Service Schedule No. 135, Net Metering Service; Docket No. 19-035-T09*

Dear Ms. Saba:

The Public Service Commission of Utah (PSC) reviewed the May 31, 2019 filing by Rocky Mountain Power (RMP) proposing changes to Electric Service Schedule No. 135, Net Metering Service ("Schedule 135"). The proposed changes to Sheet No. 135.4 of Schedule 135 update the rates applicable to large non-residential customers who select the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission Form No. 1 compensation method to receive credit for net excess generation. The proposed rates represent a 3.46 percent decrease for Schedule No. 6, a 6.33 percent decrease for Schedule No. 6A, a 5.96 percent increase for Schedule No. 6B, a 3.41 percent decrease for Schedule No. 8, and an 8.68 percent decrease for Schedule No. 10. RMP states the proposed changes are being made pursuant to the PSC's February 12, 2009 Report and Order Directing Tariff Modifications in Docket No. 08-035-78 ("2009 Order").

The PSC also reviewed the June 17, 2019 comments filed by the Division of Public Utilities (DPU). The DPU concludes the proposed changes to Schedule 135 comply with the 2009 Order and recommends the PSC approve them.

Based on the PSC's review of the filing and the DPU's recommendation, the Fifth Revision of Sheet No. 135.4 is approved as filed, effective July 1, 2019.
