Pursuant to Utah Code §§ 54-7-15, 54-10a-301, 63G-4-301 and UTAH ADMIN. CODE r. 746-1-801, the Utah Office of Consumer Services (“OCS”) joins the first issue in the Petition of Utah Association of Energy Users and University of Utah for Reconsideration and Rehearing of Commission Order (“UAE’s Petition”), which seeks reconsideration of the Public Service Commission of Utah’s (“PSC”) treatment of the pension settlement loss issue in its December 30, 2020 Order. For the reasons set out in the UAE’s Petition, the OCS concurs with UAE’s request that the PSC’s reconsider its ruling allowing RMP to recover the entirety of any year’s pension settlement loss in rates in a single year rather than amortizing the recovery of these costs over the life of the pension plan. If the PSC declines to reconsider this request, the OCS concurs with the

UAE Petition's alternative request that the PSC reconsider the PSC's ruling regarding the amount of pension settlement losses that RMP may recover through this balancing account mechanism from year to year. The OCS seeks that same relief as argued for in the UAE's Petition.
