And I don't know if Miss 7 Goupil is comfortable moving for admission of Utah Clean Energy's 8 submission. WRA would move the admission of the direct rebuttal and sur-rebuttal testimonies of Deborah Kapiloff, along with associated 11 exhibits and the direct testimony of Karl Boothman. And hearing no objection, all of the foregoing are 22 admitted into evidence. We did have a stipulation filed in this matter. 1 2 **Bob Davis:** [13:30] I have. 3 4 Patrick Grecu: [13:31] And did you review the company's application, supporting 5 exhibits, and pre-filed testimony, and the other party's testimony? 6 7 [13:39] Yes. **Bob Davis:** 8 9 Patrick Grecu: [13:40] And did you also review the settlement stipulation filed in this 10 docket? 11 12 **Bob Davis:** [13:44] I did. 13 14 Patrick Grecu: [13:46] And based on your review, is it the Division's position that the 15 settlement stipulation resolving the issues in this proceeding is just and 16 reasonable in result and in the public interest? 17 18 **Bob Davis:** [13:56] I do. 19 20 Patrick Grecu: [13:58] And do you have a summary to share supporting approval of the 21 settlement stipulation? 22 23 **Bob Davis:** [14:03] I do. 24 25 Patrick Grecu: [14:03] Please proceed. 26 27 [14:06] Good morning, Mr. Hammer. The Division has the responsibility **Bob Davis:** 28 to evaluate programs such as the Electric Vehicle Infrastructure Program, 29 or EVIP, to ensure the program is prudent and in the public interest. Since 30 its inception in 2022, the EVIP Program has performed relatively well 31 over the past three years. The Division has raised minor concerns 32 regarding the reporting and prudency of the EVIP over the 3-year period. 33 The Division appreciates Rocky Mountain Power's efforts to clarify and 34 implement modifications to its reporting template and balance sheet to 35 enable the Division to perform its annual prudency reviews as the EVIP progresses. The Division expects this level of reporting commitment to 36 continue in the remaining years of the EVIP. The Division is not aware of 37 38 any impacts to competition or rate pairs as a result of the EVIP and Rocky 39 Mountain Power has been forthcoming in providing factual information as 40 the EVIP has progressed. The Division's review of the party's changes and 41 modifications at this 3-year review of the EVIP seem to align with the 42 goals of the EVIP and comply with the statues. Therefore, the Division supports the party's stipulation as just and reasonable in result and in the 43 44 public interest and recommends the Public Service Commission approve

the stipulation. This concludes my summary. Thank you.

I appreciate the opportunity to present the settlement stipulation regarding the Electric Vehicle Infrastructure Program. Rocky Mountain Power, in collaboration with the Division of Public Utilities, Office of Consumer Services, Western Resource Advocates, and Utah Clean Energy, has reached a settlement regarding the 3-year review of the Electric Vehicle Infrastructure Program, EVIP. This stipulation reflects lessons learned since the program's inception in 2021 and proposes adjustments to ensure continued success and alignment with legislative intent. Utah Association of Energy users ChargePoint and EVgo are parties to this docket but they are not settling parties. These parties did not submit testimony on the 2025 Electric Vehicle Infrastructure Program review, participate in settlement negotiations, or provide objections to the stipulation. During the 2020 session, the Utah Legislature passed House Bill 396, Electric Vehicle Charging Infrastructure Amendment, codified in Section 54-4-41 of the Utah Code, which authorized Rocky Mountain Power to create EVIP. The Electric Vehicle Infrastructure Program launched in 2021 as a 10-year, \$50-million program to expand electric vehicle charging infrastructure across Utah. The original stipulation required a 3-year review to assess performance and make adjustments. So on or before October 3, 2025, parties submitted direct testimony in response to the company's proposed changes in the program review. On October 24, 2025, Rocky Mountain

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On October 29, 2025, the settling parties reached the settlement in principle that formed the basis for the 2025 stipulation. A summary of the 2025 stipulation are as follows: 4.5 - 4.8 million will be allocated to company-owned chargers, a half a million dollars will be allocated to education and outreach, 3.4 million will be allocated for nonresidential incentives for EV chargers through Schedule 120, incentives for residential chargers will be discontinued, make ready – electric vehicle make-ready investments will be discontinued, miscellaneous changes to Schedule 60 rates will occur, and Schedule 198, the EVIP surcharge, will

Power hosted a settlement conference to which all parties were invited.

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1 decrease effective January 1, 2026, to avoid overcollection. Rocky 2 Mountain Power will continue annual reporting and mid-year stakeholder 3 updates and a final review scheduled for – will occur on June 30, 2029. 4 Mr. Hammer, Rocky Mountain Power appreciates the collaborative effort that went into this stipulation. The proposed adjustments reflect lessons 5 6 learned over the past three years and ensure that the Electric Vehicle 7 Infrastructure Program continues to support electric vehicle adoption and 8 provides value and benefit to Utah rate payers. We respectfully request the 9 Commission's approval of this settlement. Thank you for your time and 10 consideration. This concludes my testimony. 11 12 Joe Dallas: [21:06] Thank you, Mr. Grant. Rocky Mountain Power filed this docket to conduct an in-depth review of the program following the third year – program year in accordance with the 2021 settlement stipulation approving the creation of the Electric Vehicle Infrastructure Program. The new settlement stipulation before the Commission today is the product of good-faith negotiations between parties and I believe the stipulation should be approved. Some of the key elements for the OCS include first, the settlement contains an agreement on the realignment of remaining make-

1 ready infrastructure [inaudible 23:32] to primarily support the continued 2 development of company-owned EV charging stations to focus efforts on 3 generating revenue and moving toward low cost of service. I supported 4 this in my direct testimony and continue to do so. However, another key 5 element of the stipulation is to retain some funding for EV charging 6 incentives targeted at multi-unit type facilities, as it is cost-effective, 7 delivering the lowest cost per charging port installed. I was persuaded by 8 arguments made by other parties in this case and support this element of 9 the settlement. I also support continuing a budget for consumer education 10 efforts to target EV owners and encourage enrollment in time-of-use rate 11 schedule options given the important of off-peak charging to both conserve energy and minimize electricity bills. In summary, I recommend 12 13 the Commission approve the EVIP settlement stipulation of 2025, as it is 14 just and reasonable in results and in the public interest. And that concludes 15 my statement. 16 17 Robert Moore: [24:40] Thank you. Both myself and 22 Mr. Karl Boothman were witnesses. Today, we respectfully request that 23 the Commission approve the settlement stipulation as we find it to be just 24 and reasonable in results and in the public interest. Specifically, we are 25 supportive of the settlement stipulation's inclusion of various elements of 26 WRA's testimony, including the recommendation for the continuation of 27 Schedule 120 incentives, which support a variety of unique charging use 28 cases, including multi-family and other commercial EV charging uses and 29 additionally, the settlement stipulation includes elements which encourage 30 off-peak charging through time-of-use rates as well as increased 31 participation in managed charging from EV drivers. We find this to be an 32 incredibly important element of the stipulation as off-peak charging has 33 various benefits to both EV and non-EV drivers across the system. And I 34 will again reiterate that we find that this settlement stipulation is just and 35 reasonable in results and would encourage the Commission to approve it. 36 Thank you. 37 38 Sophie Hayes: [27:27] Thank you.
