Re: *Rocky Mountain Power's Demand-Side Management (DSM) 2020 Annual Energy Efficiency and Peak Load Reduction Report; Docket No. 21-035-33*

Dear Ms. Saba:

The Public Service Commission (PSC) reviewed Rocky Mountain Power's (RMP) May 28, 2021 filing of its Demand-Side Management (DSM) 2020 Annual Energy Efficiency and Peak Load Reduction Report ("Report"). The Report was filed pursuant to the PSC's February 16, 2017 Order in Docket No. 17-035-04, Application of Rocky Mountain Power for Approval to Revise Demand Side Management Annual Energy Efficiency and Peak Load Reduction Report Requirements. The PSC also reviewed the June 24, 2021 comments of the Division of Public Utilities (DPU), the June 28, 2021 joint comments of Utah Clean Energy and the Southwest Energy Efficiency Project (UCE/SWEEP), and RMP's July 15, 2020 reply comments including an updated Report ("Updated Report").

DPU recommends the PSC acknowledge that the Report complies with the PSC's reporting requirements. DPU states the Report format has been revised to provide streamlined information with the goal of increased efficiency, however, many embedded links within the Report do not work and should be repaired.

UCE/SWEEP states that in 2020 the Home Energy Report (HER) program constituted nearly 50% of electricity savings from RMP's Demand Side Management (DSM) programs. UCE/SWEEP urges RMP to target achieving greater than 60% of its residential DSM savings from traditional Class 1 and Class 2 programs and resources. Further, UCE/SWEEP recommends RMP discuss this issue with the DSM Steering Committee.

In reply, RMP filed an Updated Report in which it corrected the non-functioning embedded links. In response to UCE/SWEEP comments relating to the HER Program, RMP states it addressed the HER topic during the June 30, 2021 DSM Steering Committee meeting and believes this issue is resolved. RMP further states that historically it has discussed the Class 2 DSM resource mix with the DSM Steering Committee following the publication of each Integrated Resource Plan (IRP). RMP will continue this practice after the next IRP is published.

Based on the PSC's review of the Report and the Updated Report, and the comments and recommendations filed by DPU and UCE/SWEEP, the PSC acknowledges that the Report complies with the PSC's reporting requirements. To the extent the DSM Advisory Group has been designated as the forum for RMP to solicit input, receive suggestions, and facilitate general discussions of DSM programs and issues, including other DSM issues of general concern,¹ the PSC requests RMP discuss its Class 2 DSM resource mix with the DSM Advisory Group as well as the DSM Steering Committee following issuance of the 2021 IRP.
