The Public Service Commission (PSC) reviewed the Division of Public Utilities' (DPU) Calendar Year 2021 Report ("Report") of the Home Electric Lifeline Program ("Program") filed on June 30, 2022. The Report was filed pursuant to the PSC's November 23, 2005 Report and Order in Docket Nos. 03-035-01 and 04-035-21.

DPU states the Program is administered well, with the eligibility of the applicants and the collection and disbursements of funds done in accordance with the Order in Docket No. 00-035-T07. Additionally, DPU states the recipients benefit without overly burdening the ratepayers. However, DPU asserts some of the Program's metrics failed to meet their respective standard, and therefore the measurement of the Program's success is inconclusive. The DPU recommends no further action.

The PSC concludes the DPU's Calendar Year 2021 Report of the Home Electric Lifeline Program complies with the PSC's reporting requirements in this matter.
