3	PRESIDING OFFICER HAMMER: Good morning.
4	We should all be here for the hearing
5	noticed in the matter of the application of U.S.
6	Magnesium, LLC, for a determination of long-term
7	rates and terms of conditions of interruptible DSM
8	electric service between it and Rocky Mountain Power.
9	That's commission docket number 21-035-53.
10	My name is Michael Hammer, and I am the
11	commission's designated presiding officer.
12	Let's go ahead and take appearances,
13	please, beginning with Rocky Mountain Power.
14	MS. WEGENER: Emily Wegener on behalf of
15	Rocky Mountain Power. I'm sitting in an unusual spot
16	because it's not my application.
17	MR. RUSSELL: Phillip Russell on behalf of
18	U.S. Magnesium. I have with me at the table
19	Mr. Roger Swenson.
20	PRESIDING OFFICER HAMMER: Thank you.
21	MS. SCHMID: Patricia E. Schmid with the
22	Utah Attorney General's Office representing the
23	Division of Public Utilities. With me at counsel
24	table is the Division's witness, Casey J. Coleman,
25	who can or who will present a brief statement

1	explaining the stipulation and the Division's support
2	for it. Thank you.
3	MR. MOORE: Robert Moore of the Attorney
4	General's Office representing the Office of Consumer
5	Services. The Office doesn't have a witness today,
6	but I can represent the Office supports the
7	stipulation.
8	PRESIDING OFFICER HAMMER: Thank you.
9	And I apologize to everyone, I'm losing my
10	voice. I'll do my best.
11	My understanding is that we're only here
12	to accept evidence today with respect to the
13	stipulation filed on May 20th, 2022.
14	Is that your understanding, Mr. Russell?
15	MR. RUSSELL: It is, your Honor.
16	PRESIDING OFFICER HAMMER: Any objection?
17	MS. WEGENER: (Shakes head.)
18	PRESIDING OFFICER HAMMER: Understood.
19	Mr Russell, as this is your application,
20	I'll ask you to call your first witness.
21	MR. RUSSELL: U.S. Magnesium calls Roger
22	Swenson.

- 1 Yes, I have. Α. 2 And are there any corrections to that 0. 3 testimony? 4 Α. You know at this time, no. Okay. And just to clarify on that, for 5 0. purposes of the stipulation about which we're here 6 today to discuss you don't have any corrections. 7 to the extent that we may admit that testimony for 8 purposes of a contested hearing later, you later you 9 10 may have some corrections that would be relevant to 11 that. Is that --12 There may be some slight corrections. Α. 13 Nothing major. 14 Okay. All right. And are you also aware 0. of a stipulation that was filed with the Commission 15 16 and an extension agreement to the current Electric 17 Service Agreement and Operating Reserve Interruption 18 Agreement between U.S. Magnesium and Rocky Mountain 19 Power? 20 Α. Yes, I am. 21 And can you briefly outline what Q. Okay. 22 that extension agreement does?
 - Α. The extension agreement lets the parties in the case continue to work towards a settlement of some outstanding terms and conditions that we hope

1 will lead us to an uncontested hearing. 2 We've made some progress, and we'd like to continue on that progress. So we thought asking for 3 4 a little bit more time made sense for all parties in 5 this matter. And does the extension agreement move the 6 0. term of the ESA and the ORIA from the end of 7 June 2022 to the end of July 2022? 8 9 Yes, it does. Α. 10 0. Okay. 11 At this point I'll move for MR. RUSSELL: 12 the admission of Mr. Swenson's testimony for purposes 13 of this stipulation as well as the stipulation of the 14 extension agreement. 15 PRESIDING OFFICER HAMMER: It's admitted. 16 (MR. SWENSON'S TESTIMONY ADMITTED.) 17 MR. RUSSELL: And I have not asked Mr. 18 Swenson to prepare a summary of his testimony 19 Because it isn't directed at the stipulation of 20 It's directed at the outstanding issues in course. 21 I'm happy to have Mr. Swenson answer any the case. 22 But maybe I'll just start with asking Mr. questions. 23 Swenson if he requests that the Commission approve 24 the stipulation.

7	MS. SCHMID: No questions. Thank you.
8	PRESIDING OFFICER HAMMER: Mr. Moore?
9	MR. MOORE: No questions. Thank you.
10	PRESIDING OFFICER HAMMER: I'd like
11	someone to outline the stipulation on the record, but
12	I don't know that Mr. Swenson needs to do that if
13	other witnesses are prepared to. So you can
14	MR. RUSSELL: Do you need me to be a
15	witness? Because I can do it fairly quickly.
16	PRESIDING OFFICER HAMMER: I'd prefer
17	testimony.
18	MR. RUSSELL: Sure.
19	PRESIDING OFFICER HAMMER: So we'll
20	proceed because I expect that the DPU may do so.
21	MS. SCHMID: The Division will just
22	address two specific provisions of the stipulation
23	and offer its support of approval. We will not be
24	walking through the stipulation as a whole.
25	PRESIDING OFFICER HAMMER: I don't know

1 | that we need to go through it paragraph by paragraph.

Mr. Russell, why don't you go ahead and make any remarks about the contents of the stipulation that you deem appropriate.

MR. RUSSELL: Sure. So there's the stipulation that we're here to talk about today. And as, Your Honor, I'm sure is aware, there was also a stipulated motion to extend some discovery dates. And those two things kind of play together, and I'll try to give a bigger picture.

After the filing of rebuttal testimony in this case, the parties started talking in earnest about resolving some outstanding issues. And those discussions have been productive and substantive. And we realize looking at the remainder of the case deadlines that there wasn't really going to be time for the parties to hash out a settlement that could be presented to the Division and to the Office with their -- with time for them to evaluate it and give any sort of recommendation to the Commission before a hearing, which was supposed to start today.

So we got together and discussed what might make sense to give the parties some time to address and, you know, attempt to resolve those issues. What we landed on was moving the case

deadlines back for a month, which was the subject of 1 2 the stipulated motion to extend that we filed last 3 week and that the commission has granted. 4 Separate from that, we also needed to move the termination date of the existing agreement back 5 from its existing June 30, 2022 date so that there 6 could be some existing terms and conditions between 7 the parties. While they negotiated, the parties 8 9 agreed to move that date from June 30th to July 31. 10 And then the stipulation simply captures -- captures 11 those circumstances. And that is that it requests 12 the Commission approve the extension of that, of the 13 termination date of both the Electric Service 14 Agreement and the Operating Reserve Interruption 15 Agreement to July 31st of 2022 to allow the parties 16 to have some time to hopefully reach a stipulated 17 resolution in this matter. 18 PRESIDING OFFICER HAMMER: Thank you, 19 Mr. Russell. That's very helpful. 20 MR. RUSSELL: Sure. 21 PRESIDING OFFICER HAMMER: We'll turn to 22 you -- well, we'll go to Ms. Wegener. No witness, 23 correct? 24 MS. WEGENER: No witness. We do have 25 Estabon Lara [phonetic] here available for questions,

1	if you have any. But no witness.
2	PRESIDING OFFICER HAMMER: Rocky Mountain
3	Power does not oppose the stipulation?
4	MS. WEGENER: No. Rocky Mountain Power
5	supports the stipulation.
6	PRESIDING OFFICER HAMMER: Ms. Schmid.
7	MS. SCHMID: Thank you. The Division
8	would like to call Mr. Casey J. Coleman as its
9	witness. May he please be sworn?
10	PRESIDING OFFICER HAMMER: Mr. Coleman, do

                  (MR. COLEMAN'S TESTIMONY ADMITTED.)
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1 MS. SCHMID: Thank you. 2 Further, Mr. Coleman, have you 3 participated in or been aware of the discussions 4 involving the extension of the ESA and the ORIA which led to the stipulation at hand being filed? 5 6 Yes, I was aware of those discussions. Α. Do you have a brief summary of the 7 Q. Division's support for that stipulation? 8 9 Α. Yes. 10 0. Please proceed. The Division of Public Utilities 11 Α. 12 recommends the Commission approve the stipulation 13 filed by the parties in this docket. There are two 14 particularly important elements to this stipulation. 15 The stipulation extends the current Electric Service 16 Agreement or ESA and Operating Reserve Interruption

20 This stipulation also provides that if 21 Rocky Mountain Power and U.S. Magnesium reach

Agreement or ORIA until the later of July 31st, 2022

or until the Commission issues its final order in

this docket.

agreement, that the new terms and conditions will go

into effect on July 1st, 2022 and will replace the

terms and conditions of the currently existing ESA.

Any new ESA agreed upon by the parties would be

1 subject to Commission approval. Either of these 2 provisions allow for rate certainty for Rocky 3 Mountain Power and U.S. Magnesium. The second 4 provision establishes a procedure to be implemented 5 if those parties reach an agreement while also giving 6 certainty to the effective date of a new negotiated agreement on a date picked by Rocky Mountain Power 7 and U.S. Magnesium. 8 By approving the stipulation as the 9 10 Division recommends both Rocky Mountain Power and 11 U.S. Magnesium can continue to engage in discussions 12 to resolve their disputes. The DPU signed the 13 stipulation after concluding that its terms and 14 conditions were in the public interest and submits 15 that the stipulation remains in the public interest 16 Therefore, the Division of Public Utilities today. 17 recommends that the Commission approve the 18 stipulation as filed. 19 Thank you, Mr. Coleman. MS. SCHMID: 20 Mr. Coleman is available for 21 cross-examination and questions from the hearing 22 officer. 23 PRESIDING OFFICER HAMMER: Mr. Russell? 24 MR. RUSSELL: No questions. Thank you. 25 PRESIDING OFFICER HAMMER: Ms. Wegener?

1	MS. WEGENER: No questions. Thank you.
2	PRESIDING OFFICER HAMMER: Mr. Moore?
3	MR. MOORE: Thank you. No questions.
4	PRESIDING OFFICER HAMMER: Mr. Coleman, in
5	order to approve the stipulation, the Commission is
6	required to find that a stipulation is just and
7	reasonable in result. Is it the Division's position
8	that this stipulation is just and reasonable in
9	result?
10	THE WITNESS: Yes.
11	PRESIDING OFFICER HAMMER: Thank you.
12	That's all I have.
13	MS. SCHMID: The Division has nothing
14	further. Thank you.
15	PRESIDING OFFICER HAMMER: Thank you.
16	And Mr. Moore, you have no witness,
17	correct.
18	MR. MOORE: We have no witness. But I'm
19	authorized to state that we support the stipulation
20	as just and reasonable in result.
21	PRESIDING OFFICER HAMMER: Thank you.
